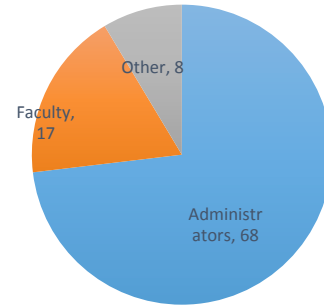


Overview

- ✦ Of the 93 attendees, the majority of participants were from community colleges and nearly all participants were from the state of Texas. When assigning a limited number of position descriptions, 68 participants are primarily from Administration either at the departmental or institutional level, while 17 identified primarily as faculty. The remaining either didn't identify their title, may work in an advising capacity, or are graduate students. Departments that were represented were from assessment offices, institutional research offices, institutional effectiveness, central administration, and various academic areas. 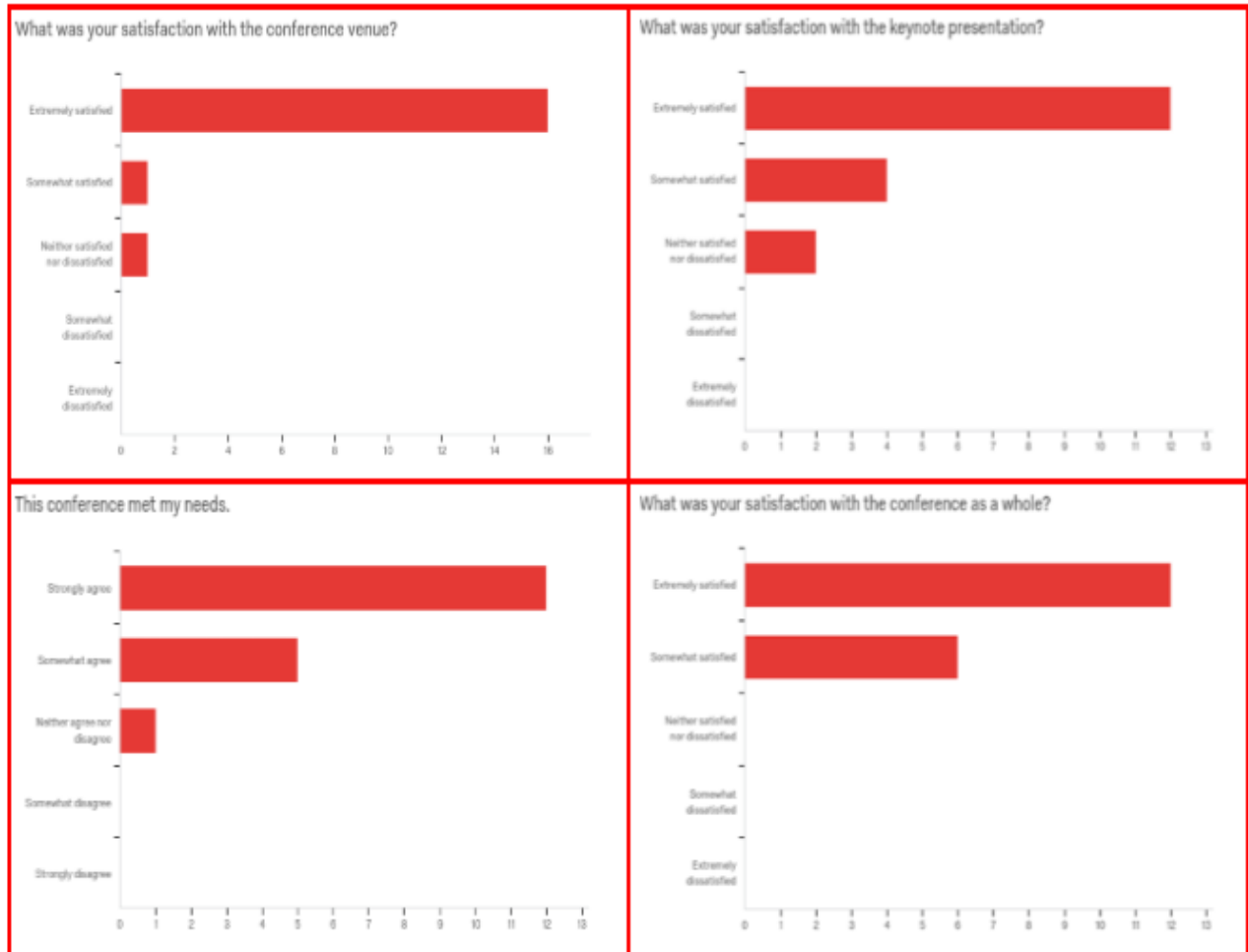

- ✦ Sponsorship and Conference Expenses
 - We had a total of 6 sponsors: University of North Texas, Taskstream, Nuventive, TTU System Office, Office of Student Success & Retention, and Angelo State University. Both Taskstream and Nuventive sent representatives to WTAC.
 - Our expenses were approximately \$7,594, with an approximate revenue of \$8,000. The revenue will be held in an account which will carry over to next year's conference funds. Expenses included venue rental, food and beverage fees, conference programs, floral items, keynote travel expenses, and the networking event held at the Overton Hotel. There were about 30 attendees that gathered for an opportunity to socialize and network with other assessment colleagues.
