Senate Resolution 41.36

(A Resolution regarding window signs stating the smoking policy)

WHEREAS, the smoking policy of Texas Tech requires people to remain 12 feet away from any entrance to a building, and

WHEREAS, many students smoking outside their residence hall are not the required 12 feet away, and

WHEREAS, many students do not like to walk through cigarette smoke on their way into the building, and

WHEREAS, secondhand smoke has been classified by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as a known cause of cancer in humans and causes an estimated 35,000 to 40,000 heart disease deaths in people who are not current smokers.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that all entrances into residence halls have window stickers informing people of the smoking policy.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution be spread upon the Journal and that copies be sent to Dr. Jon Whitmore, President of Texas Tech University; Dr. Michael Shonrock, Vice President for Student Affairs; Dr. Sam Segran, Associate Vice President for IT, Donald Dyal, Dean of Libraries, Joey Kirk Editor of the *University Daily*; and to the students of Texas Tech University.
