Minor in Agribusiness Management

Offered by the Agricultural and Applied Economics Department for non-departmental students to provide training in economics and business with an agriculture perspective. The minor requires 18 hours of Agricultural and Applied Economics (AAEC) courses including:

- Fundamentals of Agricultural and Applied Economics (AAEC 2305)
- Nine (9) hours from junior (3000) level AAEC courses
- Six (6) hours from senior (4000) level AAEC courses

Career opportunities are enhanced when an **Agribusiness Management minor** is combined with a degree in either **Animal Science** or **Plant and Soil Science**. The managerial decision making skills taught in the economics/business courses comprising the Agribusiness Management minor curriculum complement the science and agricultural science training provided by an Animal Science or Plant and Soil Science degree and enhance career options. The combined science and economics training will broaden career opportunities in agricultural sales, commodity purchasing and trading, and management of farms, ranches, and agribusiness firms.

Meat sales	Seed sales and management
Feedlot management	Equipment sales
Livestock purchasing	Elevator or gin management
Animal health product sales	Commodity trading
Feed and feed supplement sales	Farm management

Business majors can use the Agribusiness Management minor to incorporate additional economics training in their business curriculum by taking courses that apply business/economics principles to farm, ranch, and agribusiness firm management.

Res., & Economy (AAEC 4309), Ag.
