Cottonseed receipts at oil mills slowed during the week ending January 28, according to the Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Harvesting of the cotton crop is nearly completed. Most recent ginnings were from stored seed cotton. Grade certificates received from licensed chemists declined to 439 compared to 635 a week earlier.

Prices paid growers for cottonseed ranged from \$90.00 to \$155.00 per ton, about the same as a week earlier. Oil mills paid gins \$120.00 to \$140.00 per ton for cottonseed, basis grade 100 and \$105.00 to \$154.00 per ton "as is". Price ranges to both gins and to growers include advances. Wholesale prices for 41 percent protein meal ranged from \$165.00 to \$245.00 per ton in bulk lots and \$185.00 to \$255.00 per ton in sacked lots. Bulk hulls were quoted at \$40.00 to \$88.00 per ton. Sacked hulls were quoted at \$75.00 to \$90.00 per ton.

Cottonseed deliveries to western states oil mills continued to decline during the period ended January 21, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Receipts remained fairly heavy in late harvesting areas of Texas. Harvest continued in late stages in other far western localities. Grade certificates totaled 635 compared with 1,243 last week.

Prices paid growers for cottonseed varied from \$99.00 to \$155.00 per ton, about the same as a week earlier. Oil mills paid ginners \$120.00 to \$140.00 per ton for cottonseed basis grade 100 and \$120.00 to \$154.00 per ton "as is". Price ranges to both gins and to growers include advances. Wholesale prices for bulk 41 percent protein cottonseed meal ranged from \$182.00 to \$245.00 and sacked meal from \$207.00 to \$255.00. Bulk hulls were quoted from \$45.00 to \$88.00 per ton and sacked hulls from \$85.00 to \$100.00 per ton.

Cottonseed continued to move to western states cotton markets at a slow rate, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Many gins have completed seasonal operations with those remaining open ginning mostly from seed cotton stored in modules. Grade certificates totaled 1,243 this week compared with 2,369 during the previous two week reporting period.

Prices paid growers for cottonseed ranged from \$90.00 to \$155.00 per ton "as is," unchanged from a week earlier. Oil mills paid ginners from \$120.00 to \$140.00 per ton basis grade 100 and \$105.00 to \$154.00 "as is," also unchanged. Price ranges to both ginners and growers include advances. Wholesale prices for bulk 41 percent protein meal were quoted at \$182.00 to \$245.00 and sacked meal from \$220.00 to \$255.00 per ton. Bulk hull prices were \$45.00 to \$88.00 per ton and sacked hulls \$85.00 to \$100.00

Movement of cottonseed to oil mills tapered off during the period ended January 7, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Receipts were heaviest in Texas where harvesting continued at a fairly rapid pace on the Plains. Harvesting was virtually completed over most of the remainder of the Belt. Grade certificates totaled 2,369 during the reporting period compared with 496 received during the last week of December.

Prices paid growers for cottonseed ranged from \$90.00 to \$155.00 mostly on an "as is" basis. A small quantity was sold for animal food at about \$225.00. Oil mills paid ginners \$120.00 to \$140.00 per ton basis grade 100 and \$105.00 to \$154.00 on an "as is" basis. Price ranges to both gins and to growers include advances. Wholesale prices for 41 percent protein cottonseed meal ranged from \$222.00 to \$255.00 per ton for sacked meal and \$182.00 to \$256.00 bulk. Oil mills quoted bulk hulls at \$45.00 to \$88.00 per ton and sacked hulls at \$85.00 to \$100.00 per ton wholesale.

Movement of cottonseed to western states oil mills decreased during the period ended December 22, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Cotton harvesting was slowed by unfavorable weather in some localities. Harvest lingered in final stages but some field stored cotton is yet to be ginned. Grade certificates totaled 496 compared with 842 last week.

Prices paid growers for cottonseed varied from \$90.00 to \$154.00 per ton, about the same as a week earlier. Oil mills paid ginners \$120.00 to \$140.00 per ton for cottonseed and \$120.00 to \$154.00 "as is". Price ranges to both gins and to growers include advances. Wholesale prices for bulk 41 percent protein cottonseed meal ranged from \$182.00 to \$248.00 per ton and sacked meal \$217.00 to \$266.00. Bulk hulls were quoted at \$50.00 to \$81.00 and sacked hulls from \$75.00 to \$120.00 per ton.

Movement of cottonseed to oil mills picked up in active harvest areas of Texas and continued slow in other western states during the week ended December 17, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Harvesting reached advanced stages in a number of localities. Wet fields slowed final harvesting in some territories. Most recent ginnings involved cotton from storage. Grade certificates totaled 842 this week compared with 482 last week.

Prices paid growers for cottonseed were mostly unchanged at \$90.00 to \$155.00 per ton at the gin. A small quantity was sold for animal food at about \$225.00. Oil mills paid ginner \$120.00 to \$154.00 per ton for cottonseed basis grade 100 and \$105.00 to \$154.00 per ton "as is". Price ranges to both gins and to growers include advances. Wholesale prices for bulk 41 percent protein cottonseed meal ranged from \$182.00 to \$248.00 per ton and sacked meal \$217.00 to \$266.00. Bulk hulls were quoted at \$45.00 to \$81.00 and sacked hulls from \$75.00 to \$100.00 per ton.

Movement of cottonseed to oil mills in western states decreased sharply during the week ended December 10, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Harvest was in final stages but some field stored cotton remains to be ginned. Grade certificates totaled 482 compared with 677 last week.

Prices paid growers for cottonseed varied from \$90.00 to \$155.00 per ton, about the same as a week earlier. A small amount reportedly moved as animal feed at around \$225.00. Oil mills paid gins \$120.00 to \$140.00 per ton basis grade 100 and \$103.00 to \$154.00 per ton "as is" for cottonseed. Price ranges to both gins and to growers include advances. Wholesale prices for 41 percent protein meal ranged from \$182.00 to \$248.00 per ton. Sacked meal prices were quoted from \$217.00 to \$266.00 per ton, near the level of a week earlier. Bulk hulls were priced at \$50.00 to \$81.00 per ton and sacked hulls from \$75.00 to \$100.00 per ton, also about unchanged.

Cottonseed continued to move to western states oil mills at a moderate rate, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Seed receipts at southern states oil mills declined as the harvest neared completion. Cottonseed grade certificates received from licensed chemists totaled 1,190 down from 1,537 a week earlier.

This is the last week southern states will be included in the Cottonseed Review this season due to the advanced stage of harvesting.

Southern states: Growers received \$100.00 to \$155.00 per ton for cottonseed, about the same as a week earlier. Oil mills paid gins \$135.00 to \$152.00, mostly \$147.00 to \$152.00 per ton, basis grade, for cottonseed at oil mills. Wholesale prices for 41 percent protein meal ranged from \$205.00 to \$255.00 per ton. Sacked meal prices ranged from \$230.00 to \$275.00 per ton. Bulk hulls were quoted at \$45.00 to \$75.00 per ton and sacked hull prices were quoted at \$70.00 to \$98.00 per ton.

Western states: Cotton producers received \$90.00 to \$155.00 per ton for cottonseed at most mills. Gins selling cottonseed for cattle feed paid growers up to \$225.00 per ton, however this market was very limited. Oil mills paid gins \$120.00 to \$135.00 per ton basis grade and \$103.00 to \$154.00 per ton "as is" for cottonseed. Price ranges to gins and to growers include advances. Wholesale prices for 41 percent protein meal ranged from \$182.00 to \$247.00 per ton. Sacked meal quotations ranged from \$217.00 to \$260.00 per ton. Bulk hulls were priced at \$50.00 to \$81.00 per ton at oil mills and sacked hulls were quoted at \$75.00 to \$100.00 per ton.

Cottonseed deliveries declined in southern states during the six day period ended November 25, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Seed receipts at western states oil mills continued at near peak rates. Harvesting was stopped in Texas and Oklahoma by adverse weather. Grade certificates totaled 1,537 for the holiday shortened period compared to 2,909 a week earlier.

Southern states: Growers received \$100.00 to \$165.00 per ton for cottonseed, about steady compared to a week earlier. Oil mills paid ginners \$140.00 to \$152.00 per ton basis grade 100 for cottonseed, unchanged from last week. Wholesale prices for 41 percent protein cottonseed meal ranged from \$205.00 to \$250.00 mostly \$230.00 to \$245.00 per ton in bulk lots. Sacked meal was quoted at \$230.00 to \$270.00 per ton. Bulk hull prices ranged from \$45.00 to \$75.00 per ton at oil mills and sacked hulls were quoted at \$70.00 to \$98.00 per ton.

Western states: Cottonseed prices paid to growers ranged from \$90.00 to \$157.00 per ton. Oil mills paid gins \$120.00 to \$135.00 per ton basis grade and \$103.00 to \$154.00 per ton "as is". Price ranges to gins and to growers included advances with final settlements to be paid at the completion of the season's operations. Wholesale prices for 41 percent bulk protein meal ranged from \$182.00 to \$245.00 per ton and sacked meal prices were quoted at \$217.00 to \$260.00 per ton. Bulk hull prices at oil mills ranged from \$50.00 to \$85.00 per ton and sacked hulls from \$75.00 to \$100.00 per ton.

Movement of cottonseed was tapering off in south central and southeastern states but building momentum in the west and far west during the period ended November 19, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Harvesting made good to excellent progress in California, New Mexico and Arizona. Snow and much colder weather delayed the harvest on the Texas Plains. Picking was almost completed in southern states where rain delayed final harvesting. Cottonseed grade certificates totaled 2,909 compared with 2,388 last week.

Southern states: Prices paid growers for cottonseed were steady and ranged mostly from \$95.00 to \$160.00 per ton. Oil mills paid gins \$140.00 to \$152.00 per ton basis grade 100, the same as a week earlier. Wholesale prices for sacked 41 percent protein cottonseed meal ranged from \$230.00 to \$265.00 per ton and bulk meal was quoted from \$210.00 to \$245.00. Hull prices varied from \$45.00 to \$75.00 per ton bulk and \$70.00 to \$95.00 sacked.

Western states: Cottonseed prices paid to growers ranged from \$90.00 to \$205.00 per ton. Oil mill prices for seed varied from \$120.00 to \$135.00 per ton basis grade 100 and \$100.00 to \$154.00 "as is". Some prices represented an advance to growers with final settlement at a later date. Wholesale prices for bulk 41 percent protein meal varied from \$160.00 to \$240.00 per ton and \$200.00 to \$260.00 per ton sacked. Bulk hulls ranged from \$50.00 to \$81.00 per ton and sacked hulls were quoted from \$75.00 to \$100.00 per ton.

Cottonseed continued to move to oil mills in moderately heavy volume during the week ended November 12, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Picking made excellent progress in southern states where the harvest was in final stages. Harvesting was in full swing in the San Joaquin Valley, moved at a steady pace in Yuma County, Arizona and Riverside County, California and was just getting underway in the Imperial Valley. Harvesting increased on the Texas Plains following a recent freeze and moved ahead in Oklahoma. Cottonseed grade certificates totaled 2,388 compared with 2,411 last week.

Southern states: Prices paid growers for cottonseed were generally steady and ranged from \$95.00 to \$165.00 per ton, about the same as last week. Oil mills paid ginner \$140.00 to \$152.00 per ton basis grade 100, unchanged from a week earlier. Wholesale prices for sacked 41 percent protein cottonseed meal ranged from \$240.00 to \$260.00 per ton, and bulk meal from \$220.00 to \$255.00 per ton. Bulk hulls were quoted at \$45.00 to \$75.00 per ton and sacked hulls from \$40.00 to \$95.00.

Western states: Growers received from \$90.00 to \$190.00 per ton for cottonseed. Some prices represented an advance to growers with final settlement at a later date. Oil mill prices were mostly unchanged at \$120.00 to \$132.00 per ton basis grade 100. Wholesale prices for bulk 41 percent protein meal ranged from \$160.00 to \$240.00 per ton, unchanged from last week. Sacked meal was steady at \$200.00 to \$260.00 per ton. Bulk hull prices varied from \$50.00 to \$81.00 and sacked hulls from \$75.00 to \$95.00 per ton, up slightly from a week earlier.

Cottonseed moved to oil mills in western states in heavier volume as the harvest gained momentum during the week ended November 5, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Harvesting lingered in final stages in southern states. California and Arizona growers harvested at near peak levels. A killing frost was received on the Texas Plains where harvesting is rapidly gaining momentum. Eastern Oklahoma growers continued to wait for frost before general harvesting. Cottonseed grade certificates totaled 2,411 compared with 2,658 last week.

Southern states: Prices paid growers were fairly steady and ranged mostly from \$100.00 to \$165.00 per ton at the gin. Oil mills paid ginners \$140.00 to \$152.00 per ton basis grade 100, up \$5.00 to \$7.00 per ton from last week. Wholesale prices for sacked 41 percent protein cottonseed meal ranged from \$240.00 to \$265.00 per ton against \$215.00 to \$255.00 last week. Bulk hulls were quoted at \$45.00 to \$70.00 per ton and sacked hulls at \$60.00 to \$95.00.

Western states: Grower prices for cottonseed ranged from \$95.00 to \$132.00 for cottonseed. Some prices represented an advance to growers with final settlement at a later date. Oil mills paid ginners \$125.00 to \$132.00 per ton basis grade 100. Wholesale prices for bulk 41 percent protein meal ranged from \$160.00 to \$240.00 per ton, mostly \$220.00 to \$230.00. Sacked meal was \$200.00 to \$260.00 per ton, mostly \$240.00 to \$250.00. Bulk hull prices ranged mostly from \$50.00 to \$65.00 and sacked hulls from \$75.00 to \$85.00.

Cottonseed moved to oil mills in western states at increased rates during the week ended October 29, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Harvesting reached final stages in southern states and was halted in many sections by rain. California and Arizona producers picked cotton at near peak rates. Harvesting in the Plains section of Texas and in Oklahoma increased at a slow rate. Grade certificates received from licensed chemists during the week totaled 2,658 compared to 3,635 last week and 3,082 for the comparable week last season.

Southern states: The average grades of cottonseed declined in most southern states as harvesting reached advanced stages. Prices received by growers were about steady to slightly lower this week and ranged from \$100.00 to \$160.00 per ton. Average prices received by growers by states ranged from \$112.00 in North Carolina to \$131.00 per ton in Mississippi. Oil mills paid gins \$140.00 to \$145.00, mostly \$145.00 per ton basis grade 100. Product prices at oil mills were about steady.

Western states: Texas, Oklahoma and New Mexico growers received \$100.00 to \$130.00 per ton and advances of \$115.00 to \$120.00 per ton for cottonseed. Arizona growers received advances of \$86.00 to \$95.00 and prices of \$100.00 to \$124.00 per ton. California growers received \$90.00 to \$95.00 per ton seed advances in the Imperial Valley and \$142.00 to \$188.00, mostly \$142.00 to \$144.00 per ton in the San Joaquin Valley. Oil mills paid gins in western states \$120.00 to \$132.00 per ton for cottonseed basis grade 100 and \$96.00 to \$147.00 per ton "as is". Wholesale prices for cottonseed products were about steady compared to a week earlier.

Movement of cottonseed to oil mills continued at a steady rate during the week ended October 22, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Rain delayed harvesting a few days in the central and southeastern portions of the Belt but picking was again building momentum as fields dried. Harvesting moved past the two-thirds point in south central and southeastern states, neared completion in central Texas and expanded in the Texas Plains, Oklahoma, New Mexico, Arizona and California. Cottonseed grade certificates totaled 3,635 against 3,402 last week.

Southern states: Prices received by growers were steady to slightly higher and ranged from \$100.00 to \$165.00 per ton at the gin, about \$5.00 per ton above last week. Oil mills in southern states paid ginners \$135.00 to \$145.00 per ton for seed basis grade 100, unchanged from last week. Wholesale prices for sacked 41 percent protein cottonseed meal ranged from \$215.00 to \$255.00 per ton, up about \$5.00 from a week earlier. Prices for bulk hulls varied from \$35.00 to \$70.00 per ton and sacked hulls from \$65.00 to \$85.00, the same as last week.

Northern states: Growers received \$100.00 to \$187.00 per ton, mostly \$100.00 to \$120.00 for cottonseed and advances of \$86.00 to \$90.00 per ton. Seed advances to gins in some Arizona, California and Texas areas varied from \$88.00 to \$130.00 per ton. Oil mills paid gins mostly \$130.00 per ton basis grade 100. Wholesale prices for bulk 41 percent protein meal were \$150.00 to \$230.00 per ton, mostly \$210.00 to \$220.00 and \$210.00 to \$250.00 per ton sacked, mostly \$230.00 to \$240.00. Bulk hull prices varied from \$45.00 to \$81.00 per ton, mostly \$50.00 to \$65.00 and sacked hulls ranged from \$70.00 to \$100.00.

Cottonseed moved to oil mills at an increasing rate during the week ended October 15, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Harvesting made good to excellent progress in the southeastern and south central states and in central Texas and Oklahoma. In the far west picking was building momentum. Cottonseed grade certificates totaled 3,402 compared with 1,575 last week.

Southern states: Prices paid to growers were mostly steady and ranged from \$90.00 to \$160.00 per ton at the gin. Oil mills in southern states paid ginner \$135.00 to \$145.00 per ton for seed basis grade 100. Wholesale prices for sacked 41 percent protein cottonseed meal ranged from \$210.00 to \$255.00 per ton. Prices for bulk hulls varied from \$35.00 to \$70.00 per ton and sacked hulls from \$65.00 to \$85.00.

Western states: Grower prices for cottonseed ranged from \$100.00 to \$130.00 per ton. Oil mills paid ginner \$120.00 to \$142.00 per ton basis grade 100. Oil mill prices for seed were mostly Texas and Oklahoma. Wholesale prices for sacked 41 percent protein meal ranged from \$228.00 to \$250.00 per ton. Bulk meal was quoted from \$187.00 to \$230.00 per ton. Sacked hulls traded from \$65.00 to \$88.00 and bulk hulls moved from \$45.00 to \$85.00 per ton.

Cottonseed moved to oil mills at an increasing rate during the week ended September 24, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Harvesting and ginning gained momentum in southeastern and south central states and continued to make good progress in central Texas. Only a few gins were still operating in south Texas where harvest was about completed. Showers moved across portions of south central states, temporarily delaying picking. Grade certificates received from licensed chemists during the period totaled 1,294.

Prices for cottonseed and cottonseed products were mostly steady. Ginners in southern and southeastern states paid growers \$100.00 to \$160.00 per ton for cottonseed. Oil mills paid ginners \$135.00 to \$140.00 per ton basis grade 100. Ginners in Texas paid growers \$80.00 to \$130.00 per ton "as is". Corpus Christi area growers received about \$100.00 per ton basis grade 100 for seed at the gin. Oil mills paid ginners in Texas \$120.00 to \$130.00 per ton basis grade 100. Wholesale prices for sacked 41 percent protein cottonseed meal ranged from \$221.00 to \$260.00 per ton. Sacked hulls were quoted from \$68.00 to \$98.00 per ton.

Cottonseed production for 1980 was forecast at 4.58 million tons, according to the Crop Reporting Board. This was based on a three year average lint-seed ratio and expected production of 11.7 million bales. The current cottonseed projection is 21 percent below 1979. Acreage of all cotton for harvest was estimated 13.3 million acres, four percent more than last year.

Movement of cottonseed to Texas oil mills was again on the upswing following recent rains. Picking was virtually completed in Harlingen and Corpus Christi territories. Land preparation was well advanced in these earlier areas. Picking made good headway in the Austin territory and moved along rapidly in the Dallas area. Elsewhere across the Belt the harvest was in initial stages.

Cottonseed prices paid to growers ranged from \$90.00 to \$125.00 per ton at the gin. Corpus Christi area growers received \$105.00 per ton, basis grade 100, for seed at the gin. Oil mills paid ginner \$120.00 to \$130.00 per ton basis grade 100 and around \$122.00 per ton on an "as is" basis. Wholesale prices for sacked 41 percent protein cottonseed meal ranged from \$216.00 to \$240.00 per ton with bulk meal trading from \$200.00 to \$215.00. Bulk hulls were quoted from \$50.00 to \$55.00 per ton and sacked hulls from \$74.00 to \$80.00.

Harvesting and ginning slowed in south Texas and cottonseed receipts at oil mills declined during the week ending September 10, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Rains slowed picking in some central Texas areas late in the week. First bales of 1980-crop cotton have been ginned in most states, but general harvest has been limited to Texas. Cottonseed grade certificates received from licensed chemists totaled 491 this week.

Prices paid Texas growers for cottonseed averaged slightly higher at \$103.90 per ton compared to \$102.10 a week ago. "As is" prices paid growers ranged from \$89.00 to \$125.00 per ton. Oil mills paid ginners \$120.00 to \$125.00 per ton basis grade 100 and \$117.00 per ton "as is" for cottonseed. Wholesale product prices were about steady with a week earlier.

Cottonseed moved to Texas oil mills at a slower pace during the week ended September 3, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Harvesting is virtually completed in the Harlingen and Corpus Christi areas and in late stages in the Upper Coastal Bend. Harvesting moved rapidly in the Austin area and picking advanced northward into the Dallas territory. Cottonseed grade certificates received totaled 367 compared with 494 last week.

Cottonseed prices paid to growers on an "as is" basis ranged from \$85.00 to \$115.00 per ton. Oil mills paid ginners \$120.00 per ton for seed basis grade 100. Wholesale prices for cottonseed meal and hulls were fairly steady. Sacked 41 percent protein meal was quoted at \$211.00 to \$228.00 per ton and bulk meal from \$195.00 to \$210.00 per ton. Bulk cottonseed hulls traded from \$50.00 to \$54.00 per ton with sacked hulls moving in the \$74.00 to \$80.00 per ton range.

Cottonseed movement to south Texas oil mills continued at a steady pace during the week ended August 27, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Gins continued to reduce the large volume of stored cotton in the Corpus Christi area, but the process has been slow since some modules are wet. Harvesting in the central Texas Blacklands continues at a rapid pace with a steady northward movement. Grade certificates received from licensed chemists totaled 494 for the week ended August 27.

Growers received prices ranging from \$89.00 to \$120.00 per ton on an "as is" basis, up slightly from last week. Oil mill prices for cottonseed were steady at \$120.00 per ton basis grade 100. Cottonseed grades fell within the 71.0 to 106.0 range. Wholesale prices for sacked 41 percent protein cottonseed meal were \$201.00 to \$223.00. Sacked hull prices varied from \$68.00 to \$80.00 per ton.

Cottonseed movement to south Texas oil mills was at a steady pace during the week ended August 20, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA.
