

Receipts of cottonseed at oil mills continued to decline during the week ended January 22, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Harvesting and ginning neared completion throughout the Cotton Belt. Cottonseed grade certificates received during the period totaled 425, compared with 833 a week earlier.

Prices to gins for cottonseed at oil mills ranged from \$55 to \$65 per ton, basis grade 100, and \$65 to \$70 per ton as is. Growers received \$50 to \$89 per ton for seed at the gin. Cottonseed meal prices were steady to higher. Hull prices were steady.

Cottonseed production in the United States in 1985-86 was forecast at 5.37 million tons (4.87 million metric tons) by the Crop Reporting Board, SRS, USDA, on January 10. The estimate was based on a three year average lint-seed ratio and was up 4 percent from 1984-85 production of 15 million tons (4.67 million metric tons).

Receipts of cottonseed at oil mills continued to decrease during the week ended January 15, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Harvesting and ginning were completed in most areas of the Cotton Belt. Oklahoma, Arizona, and the Rolling Plains of Texas have about 15 percent of the crop remaining to be ginned. Cottonseed grade certificates received during the period totaled 833, compared to 775 a week earlier.

Oil mill prices for cottonseed ranged from \$55\$ to \$65 per ton, basis grade 100. Grades ranged from Below Grade to 108.0, and averaged 94.6. Growers received \$50 to \$89 per ton at the gin, mostly \$55 to \$75 per ton. Cottonseed meal prices were higher and hull prices continued steady.

In the United States, total cottonseed exports for the August-July 1984-85 marketing year were 54,230 tons for a total value of \$13 million compared to the previous year trade and value evels of 45,161 tons and \$15 million, according to the Foreign Agricultural Service, USDA. exico remains the most important U.S. cottonseed market, accounting for 96 percent of total U.S. exports. Mexico's cottonseed imports are expected to increase significantly during 1985-86 to supplement lower domestic production. The government's policy of maintaining high employment in Northern Mexico's cottonseed crushing mills contributes to the higher import level. The additional imports are expected to be of U.S. origin.

Cottonseed receipts at oil mills declined sharply in west Texas and Oklahoma during the week ended January 8, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Almost all cottonseed recently produced in North and South Carolina had been sold for cattle feed rather than being moved to oil mills. Harvesting was virtually complete and ginning at least 95 percent complete in all cotton producing areas. Grade certificates received during the week totaled 775.

Growers received \$40 to \$89 per ton, as is, for cottonseed at the gin, with most prices ranging from \$45 to \$75 per ton. Oil mills paid ginners \$50 to \$65 per ton, basis grade 100. Grades ranged from 51.5 to 113.0 and averaged 95.1 Prices paid for livestock feeding use ranged from \$65 to \$75 per ton. Cottonseed meal prices were steady to slightly higher and hull prices were steady.

World cottonseed production for 1985-86 is estimated at 31.3 million tons, down nearly 7 pertent from last year's record of 33.5 million tons, but 13 percent above the past five-year average, according to the Foreign Agricultural Service, USDA. China, the world's largest cottonseed producer, is expected to have another large crop, forecast at 8.9 million tons. In the USSR, a nearly 6 percent yield increase is expected to raise the cottonseed crop to 4.97 million tons. U.S. cottonseed production for 1985 is estimated at 4.98 million tons, up nearly 7 percent over last year.

World crush of cottonseed in 1985-86 is forecast to fall 6 percent from last year's world record. The USSR, United States and Egypt are the only major cottonseed crushers expected to increase crushing over the previous year levels.

In the United States, the feed, seed and waste disappearance of cottonseed is expected to account for 24 percent of total production. Direct livestock feeding use of cottonseed, along with seed and waste, have accounted for 20 to 25 percent of U.S. cottonseed dissappearance since 1980.

Cottonseed receipts at oil mills slowed in most areas of the Cotton Belt during the two week period ended December 31, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Harvesting and ginning were virtually completed in all states except Oklahoma, Arizona, and portions of the Rolling Plains of Texas. Cottonseed grade certificates received during the period totaled 1,897.

Prices received by growers for cottonseed at the gin ranged from \$40 to \$89 per ton, as is, mostly \$45 to \$70. Oil mills paid ginners \$50 to \$65 per ton, basis grade 100. Cottonseed grades ranged from Below Grade to 107.0 and averaged 94.1. Prices paid growers for cottonseed by dairies and cattle feeders ranged from \$60 to \$70 per ton in southern states and \$75 to \$90 per ton in Texas and Oklahoma. Prices for cottonseed meal and hulls were unchanged to slightly higher.

Cottonseed receipts at oil mills totaled 885,000 tons during November, according to the Bureau f the Census. This was down from 934,000 tons a month earlier and 1,288,000 tons a year ago. eccipts through November totaled 2,405,000 tons, the largest for the first four months of the season since 1982 and up from 2,370,000 tons a year earlier and 1,732,000 tons two years ago. Crushings during November totaled 399,000 tons, up from 338,000 tons the previous month but down from 423,000 tons a year earlier. Crushings through November (four months) totaled 1,128,000 tons. This was the largest for this period since 1982 and was up from 840,000 tons a year earlier and 777,000 tons two years ago. Cottonseed on hand at oil mills on November 23 totaled 1,683,000 tons, up from 1,196,000 a month earlier and 1,646,000 a year ago.

Cottonseed receipts at oil mills were heaviest in Texas and Oklahoma during the week ended December 18, although harvesting was occasionally interrupted by unfavorable weather, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Cottonseed movement was tapering off across the remainder of the Belt as harvesting neared completion or was delayed by inclement weather. Cottonseed grade certificates received during the week totaled 2,158 compared with 1,651 a week earlier.

Oil mill prices for basis grade 100 cottonseed were about unchanged and ranged from \$50 to \$65 per ton. Cottonseed grades ranged from Below Grade to 110.5 and averaged 94.4. This was up slightly from last week's average of 90.9. Growers received from \$40 to \$90 per ton for cottonseed at the gin, mostly \$50 to \$65. Prices paid growers for cottonseed for use as animal feed ranged mostly from \$75 to \$147 per ton, in western and far western states. Prices for cottonseed meal and hulls were about unchanged.

Production of crude cottonseed oil totaled 103,217,000 pounds in October 1985, up sharply from the 60,748,000 pounds produced in September, according to the Bureau of the Census. Stocks of crude oil at oil mill locations at the end of October were 20,312,000 pounds, up slightly from 19,192,000 pounds at the end of September. Production of cottonseed cake and meal totaled 146,584 tons in October, up from 90,670 tons in September. Stocks of cake and meal continued to decline and were 30,846 tons compared with 68,193 tons at the end of September.



Cottonseed receipts at oil mills increased in Texas and Oklahoma and were heavy prior to being halted by rain and ice very late in the week ended December 11, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Cottonseed movement was light to moderate in other areas of the Cotton Belt, limited either by advanced stages of harvesting and ginning or unfavorable weather conditions. Cottonseed grade certificates received during the week totaled 1,651 compared to 1,830 a week earlier.

Oil mill prices for basis grade 100 cottonseed were steady and ranged from \$50 to \$65 per ton. Cottonseed grades ranged from Below Grade to 110.0 and averaged 90.9, up from 89.1 the previous week. Growers received from \$35 to \$90 per ton, as is, for cottonseed at the gin, mostly \$45 to \$70. Prices paid growers for cottonseed for animal feed ranged from \$60 to \$90 per ton in southern states, \$75 to \$90 in Texas and Oklahoma, and \$110 to \$130 in California. Prices for cottonseed meal and hulls were steady to slightly lower.

ottonseed production for the 1985-86 season based on a three year average lint-seed ratio, was forecast at 5.48 million tons as of December 1, according to the Crop Reporting Board, Statistical Reporting Service, USDA. This compares with the November forecast of 5.51 million tons and is 7 percent above the 1984-85 production of 5.15 million tons.

Cottonseed receipts at oil mills slowed in almost all areas of the Cotton Belt during week ended December 4, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Harvesting efforts in Texas and Oklahoma were hampered by rain during most of the period. Late harvesting operations were also hindered in southern states and far western states by rain and wet fields. Cottonseed grade certificates received during the week totaled 1,830 compared with 1,948 the previous week.

Prices paid growers for cottonseed ranged from \$35 to \$90 per ton, as is, mostly \$50 to \$70. Oil mills paid ginners \$50 to \$65 per ton, basis grade 100. Cottonseed grades ranged from Below Grade to 110.0 and averaged 89.1, down slightly from 89.3 a week earlier. Prices paid growers for cottonseed by dairies and cattle feeders were about unchanged from a week ago. Cottonseed meal and hull prices continued steady.

the Census. This was the largest October receipts since 1982 and was up from 835,000 tons a year earlier and 608,000 tons two years ago. Through October this season (August-October), receipts totaled 1,512,000 tons, the largest since 1981. August-October receipts totaled 1,083,000 tons last year and 809,000 tons two years ago. Oil mills crushed 330,000 tons of cottonseed during October. This was the largest October volume crushed since 1982 and was up from 274,000 tons the previous year and 188,000 tons two years ago. Crushings through October were the largest for the first three months of any season since 1982 and totaled 722,000 tons. This was up from 417,000 tons crushed a year earlier and 475,000 tons two years ago. Stocks of cottonseed on hand at oil mills totaled 1,196,000 tons on October 26, the largest since 1982. At the end of October a year earlier, stocks at oil mills totaled 782,000 tons and two years ago 705,000 tons.

Cottonseed receipts at oil mills slowed in most states but increased in west Texas and Oklahoma during the week ended November 27, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Harvesting in west Texas and Oklahoma gained momentum after the freeze received last week. Picking was almost completed and ginning was past the peak in California and Arizona. In the southern states, ginning was well past 90 percent completed and the very late stages of the harvest continued to be interrupted by rains. Cottonseed grade certificates decreased and totaled 1,948 compared with 2,628 a week earlier.

Oil mill prices paid ginners for cottonseed continued steady at \$50 to \$65 per ton. Cotton-seed grades were lower, ranging from Below Grade to 109.0, and averaged 89.3 compared with 92.5 a week ago. Prices received by growers at the gin were steady to slightly lower and ranged from \$30 to \$90 per ton, as is, mostly \$45 to \$70. Prices paid growers for cottonseed for animal feed ranged from \$60 to \$90 per ton in southern states, \$75 to \$90 in Texas and \$17 to \$140 in California. Prices for cottonseed meal and hulls were steady.

Production of cottonseed oil totaled 56,862,000 pounds in September 1985, up slightly from 55,944,000 pounds in August, according to the Bureau of the Census. Consumption of both edible and inedible products totaled 41,023,000 pounds. Of the 40,876,000 pounds of edible products, 11,639,000 pounds were used in baking or frying and 24,951,000 pounds in salad or cooking oil. Stocks of refined cottonseed oil at the end of September 1985 were 75,887,000 pounds.

Cottonseed moved to oil mills in moderate to heavy volume across the Cotton Belt during the week ended November 20, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Harvesting resumed in Texas and Oklahoma after several days of rain and fog. The southern states continued to make harvesting progress, despite periods of rain. Many localities have reached 85 to 95 percent completion. In California and Arizona, movement of cotton-seed remained heavy but not at peak levels of two weeks ago.

Prices received by growers at the gin remained steady and ranged from \$35 to \$90 per ton, as is, mostly \$45 to \$70. Prices paid by dairies and cattle feeders ranged from \$55 to \$90 per ton in southern states, \$70 to \$90 in Texas and \$73 to \$115 in the western states. Oil mill prices for basis grade 100 cottonseed were steady at \$50 to \$65 per ton. Cottonseed grade certificates increased sharply and totaled 2,628 against 1,316 a week ago. Cottonseed grades ranged from Below Grade to 112.0 and averaged lower at 92.5 compared with 95.5 a week earlier.

Cottonseed receipts at oil mills totaled 394,000 tons during September, according to the Bureau of the Census. This was the largest September receipts since 1977 and was up from 162,000 tons a year earlier. Receipts through September (two months) totaled 585,000 tons, also the largest since 1977 and up from 248,000 tons a year earlier. Crushings totaled 197,000 tons during September, the largest September crushings since 1982 and up from 143,000 a year ago. Stocks of cottonseed on hand at oil mills totaled 560,000 tons on September 28. This was the largest end-of-September stocks at oil mills since 1982 and was up from 221,000 tons a year ago.

Movement of cottonseed to oil mills across the Cotton Belt continued heavy during the week ended November 13, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Cottonseed receipts began to taper off in southern states as picking reached late stages and the momentum of the harvest was not recaptured after recent rains. In California and Arizona, movement of cottonseed remained heavy, despite periods of rain. Rains kept harvesting on an intermittent basis in parts of Texas and Oklahoma. Cottonseed grade certificate receipts were up slightly this week and totaled 1,316 against 1,190 a week earlier.

Oil mill prices for basis grade 100 cottonseed were fairly steady and ranged from \$50 to \$65 per ton. Cottonseed grades were lower in some localities and ranged from 55.5 to 108.5 and averaged 95.5. Grades ranged from 71.5 to 106.5 last week. Growers received from \$35 to \$90 per ton, as is, for cottonseed at the gin, mostly \$45 to \$70. Prices paid growers for cotton-seed for animal feed ranged from \$60 to \$90 per ton in southern states, \$67 to \$90 in Texas, and \$100 to \$127 in California. Cottonseed meal continued to trade readily and prices were lime to slightly higher. Prices for hulls were fairly steady.

Cottonseed production for the 1985-86 season, based on a three year average lint-seed ratio, was forecast at 5.51 million tons as of November 1, according to the Crop Reporting Board, Statistical Reporting Service, USDA. This compares with the October forecast of 5.42 million tons and is 7 percent above the 1984-85 production of 5.15 million tons.

Cottonseed moved to oil mills in heavy volume in the western states, during the week ended November 6, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. In the southern states, rain and advanced stages of harvesting slowed movement of cottonseed and oil mill receipts were light. Harvesting resumed in some localities late in the period. Cotton harvesting expanded on the Rolling and High Plains of Texas and in Oklahoma and oil mill receipts were increasing. Cottonseed grade certificate receipts declined again this week and totaled 1,190 compared with 1,966 a week ago.

Prices received by growers at the gin were slightly lower, ranging from \$35 to \$90 per ton, as is, with most prices from \$45 to \$60 per ton. Oil mill prices paid ginners for cottonseed, basis grade 100, continued steady at \$50 to \$65 per ton. Cottonseed grades were slightly higher and ranged from 71.5 to 106.5 and averaged 94.7 compared with 94.0 a week earlier. Prices paid by dairies and cattle feeders were lower in the Far West, ranging from \$72 to \$115 per ton. Prices were steady in the southern states at \$60 to \$95 per ton, but increased slightly in Texas and Oklahoma and ranged from \$67 to \$80 per ton. Prices for cottonseed meal and hulls were steady to slightly lower.

Production of crude cottonseed oil totaled 60,756,000 pounds in September 1985, about unchanged from the 60,880,000 pounds produced in August, according to the Bureau of the Census. Stocks of crude oil at oil mill locations at the end of September were 19,319,000 pounds, up from 13,763,000 pounds at the end of August. Production of cottonseed cake and meal totaled 90,676,000 pounds in September, up from 87,933,000 pounds in August. Stocks of cake and meal continued to decline sharply and were 68,266,000 pounds compared with 103,407,000 pounds at the end of August.

Harvesting expandly rapidly in the Far West and cottonseed moved to oil mills in heavy volume during the week ended October 30, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Except for the southern portions of Georgia and Alabama, rains and wet fields continued to delay harvesting in most southern states. Movement of cottonseed to oil mills slowed as many gins began to catch up. A few gins continued to operate from stored seed cotton. After recent rains, harvesting was beginning on a limited scale on the Rolling and High Plains of Texas and in Oklahoma. Cottonseed grade certificate receipts decreased and totaled 1,966 compared with 3,147 a week earlier.

Oil mill prices paid ginners for cottonseed, basis grade 100, were steady and ranged from \$50 to \$65 per ton. Cottonseed grades were lower and ranged from Below Grade to 105.0 and averaged 94.0 compared with 96.5 a week ago. Growers received \$40 to \$90 per ton, as is, for cottonseed at the gin, mostly \$45 to \$70 per ton. Prices paid by dairies and cattle feeders for cottonseed increased in the Far West and ranged from \$80 to \$140 per ton. Prices were steady elsewhere and ranged from \$60 to \$80 per ton in Texas and Oklahoma and \$60 to \$95 per ton in e southern states. Prices advanced \$5 to \$20 per ton for cottonseed meal as demand continued strong. Prices for hulls were steady.

The October forecast of 1985-86 world cottonseed production is now placed at 31.3 million metric tons, 0.6 million tons above last month's forecast, but 1.8 million tons below 1984-85, according to the Foreign Agricultural Service, USDA. The world's largest producers, with 70 percent of the total, were the United States with 4.91 million tons, the USSR with 5.05 million tons, India with 3.04 million tons and China with 8.88 million tons.

Cottonseed receipts at oil mills in the Far West increased and volume was heavy; however, rains interrupted movement slightly during the week ended October 23, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Receipts remained heavy in most southeastern states. Rains continued to limit harvesting in south central states and central Texas and cottonseed receipts declined. Heavy rains stopped the harvest in Oklahoma and delayed harvesting activities in the Rolling and High Plains of Texas. Cottonseed grade certificates increased sharply and totaled 3,147 compared with 1,720 a week ago.

Growers received from \$35 to \$107 per ton, as is, for cottonseed at the gin with most prices ranging from \$45 to \$70 per ton. Oil mills paid ginners \$50 to \$65 per ton, basis grade 100. Cottonseed grades improved slightly and ranged from 55.0 to 109.0 and averaged 96.5 compared with 95.3 a week earlier. Prices paid by dairies and cattle feeders for cottonseed increased and ranged from \$80 to \$127 in the Far West, \$62 to \$80 in Texas and Oklahoma, and \$60 to \$95 in the southern states. Demand for cottonseed meal remained strong and prices advanced \$10 to \$30 per ton. Prices for hulls continued steady.

Production of crude cottonseed oil totaled 60,828,000 pounds in August 1985, down from 62,925,000 pounds in July, according to the Bureau of the Census. Stocks of crude oil at oil mill locations at the end of August were 13,583,000 pounds compared with 18,268,000 pounds at the end of July. Production of cottonseed cake and meal totaled 87,933,000 pounds in August 1985, up slightly from 86,233,000 pounds in July. Stocks of cake and meal decreased sharply and were 103,194,000 pounds at the end of August compared with 134,456,000 pounds at the end of July.

Cottonseed moved to oil mills in heavy volume in southern states during the week ended October 16, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Harvesting was halted in the Delta states by heavy rains late in the period. Gins continued to operate from stored seed cotton. Rains also hindered harvesting efforts in Texas and Oklahoma. Harvesting was gaining momentum in the Far West. Cottonseed grade certificate receipts decreased and totaled 1,720 compared with 2,238 a week earlier.

Oil mill prices for cottonseed basis grade 100 were steady to slightly higher and ranged from \$50 to \$65 per ton. Cottonseed grades were lower and ranged from Below Grade to 108.0 and averaged 95.3 compared with 96.3 a week ago. Prices paid growers at the gin ranged from \$35 to \$100 per ton, mostly \$40 to \$65. Prices paid by dairies and cattle feeders continued to be above those paid by oil mills in many localities and ranged from \$50 to \$122 per ton, mostly \$60 to \$90. Demand for cottonseed meal continued to improve and prices advanced \$5 to \$28 per ton. Prices for hulls were steady.

ottonseed production for the 1985-86 season, based on a three year average lint-seed ratio, is forecast at 5.42 million tons as of October 1, according to the Crop Reporting Board, Statistical Reporting Service, USDA. The forecast is 5 percent above the 1984-85 production of 5.15 million tons.

Cottonseed receipts continued to increase at oil mills during the week ended October 9, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Cotton harvesting progressed rapidly and cottonseed moved to oil mills in heavy volume in the southern states. Receipts declined in central Texas and were steady in Oklahoma despite scattered showers that interrupted havesting. In the Far West, harvesting was in initial stages. Grade certificates received during the period totaled 2,238.

Oil mill prices for cottonseed ranged from \$50 to \$64 per ton, basis grade 100 (mostly \$50). Growers received \$40 to \$100 per ton (mostly \$40 to \$65) at the gin. Cottonseed grades ranged from 44.0 to 110.0 and averaged 96.3. Demand for cottonseed meal improved and prices advanced \$5 to \$10 per ton in some localities. Demand for hulls was generally weaker and prices averaged slightly lower.

e sale of whole cottonseed for cattle feed increased. Prices paid ranged from \$108-\$135 in California to \$48-\$80 in Arkansas. Other states reporting sales were Alabama, Georgia, Mississippi and Texas. Prices weakened as larger volumes of cottonseed became available.

Harvesting and ginning were halted or delayed by rain in nearly all states late in the week ended October 1, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. The harvest is finished in south Texas, virtually complete in central Texas, had expanded rapidly in southern states before the rain and was getting under way in Arizona and California. Cottonseed grade certificates received this season through October 1 totaled 6,617. This is the first "Cottonseed Review" for the 1985-86 season and will be issued weekly during active cotton harvesting.

Oil mill prices for cottonseed ranged from \$50 to \$64, basis grade 100. Grades ranged from Below Grade to 113.5 and averaged 96.4. Growers received from \$35 to \$80 per ton at the gin. Dairies in Texas and Georgia paid \$64 to \$90 per ton for whole seed.

Cottonseed receipts at oil mills totaled 190,000 tons during August, according to the Bureau f the Census. This was the largest August receipts since 1977 and was up from 86,000 tons a ear earlier and 121,000 tons two years ago. August crushings totaled 194,000 tons, up from 70,000 tons the previous year and 167,000 tons crushed in August 1983. Stocks of cottonseed at oil mills totaled 401,000 tons at the end of August. This was up from 132,000 tons a year earlier and 325,000 tons at the end of August 1983.
