Prices received by growers for cottonseed at the gin ranged from \$65 to \$125 per ton during the week ending January 27, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Prices paid growers for cottonseed by cattle feeders ranged from \$90 to \$125 in New Mexico and Texas. American Pima growers received \$76 to \$100 per ton for cottonseed at the gin. Grade certificates received during the period totaled 539, compared with 831 for the previous week. Cottonseed grades ranged from Below Grade to 11.0 and averaged 92.2, up slightly from 91.9 a week earlier.

Cottonseed receipts at oil mills totaled 357,000 tons in December, according to the Bureau of the Census. This was down sharply from 635,000 tons last season and 678,000 tons two years ago. Cumulative receipts this season, August through December, totaled 2,257,000 tons against 3,102,000 tons last year and 3,049,000 tons in 1984. Oil mills crushed 281,000 tons of cottonseed during December compared with 369,000 tons a year earlier and 424,000 tons two years ago. Through December (five months) crushings totaled 1,061,000 tons down from 1,510,000 tons last year and 1,264,000 tons two years ago. Oil mills had 1,543,000 tons of cottonseed on hand at the end of December, compared with 1,998,000 tons in 1985 and 1,900,000 tons in 1984.

Production of refined cottonseed oil totaled 90,728,000 pounds in November 1986, up from 73,540,000 pounds in October, according to the Bureau of the Census. Consumption of both edible and inedible products totaled 52,821,000 pounds during November. Of the November total, 37,800,000 pounds were used in salad or cooking oil and 10,724,000 pounds were used in baking or frying fats. The total cottonseed oil stocks at the end of November were 1,075,000 pounds, 64,769,000 pounds of refined oil and 36,306,000 pounds of crude oil.

Growers received \$65 to \$125 per ton for cottonseed at the gin during the week ending January 20, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Prices paid for cottonseed used for feeding livestock ranged from \$100 to \$125 in Texas. American Pima growers received \$96 per ton for cottonseed at the gin. Grade certificates received during the period totaled 831, compared with 901 for the week earlier. Cottonseed grades ranged from Below Grade to 108.5 and averaged 91.9, down from 95.2 a week ago.

U.S. cottonseed production, based on a three year average lint-seed ratio, is expected to be 3,856,900 tons in 1986-87, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board, NASS, USDA. The major cottonseed producing states and their estimated production are: Texas with 1,061,300 tons; California 923,400; Mississippi 448,600; Arizona 319,000; Louisiana 245,800; Arkansas 222,400; Tennessee 156,600 and Alabama 117,300.

World oilseed production for 1986-87 is forecast at 195.2 million tons, down 1 percent from last month, but slightly above last year's record, according to the World Agricultural Outlook Board, USDA. Downward revisions for Chinese cottonseed and peanuts accounted for much of this month's change. Small reductions in the U.S. cottonseed and soybean crops were partially offset by upward revisions in the U.S. peanut and sunflower seed crops.

Growers received \$65 to \$125 per ton for cottonseed at the gin during the week ending January 13, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Prices paid for cottonseed used for feeding livestock ranged from \$90 to \$125 in Texas. American Pima growers received \$76 to \$120 per ton for cottonseed at the gin. Grade certificates received during the period totaled 901, compared with 753 for the two week period ending January 6. Cottonseed grades ranged from Below Grade to 111.0, the same as the previous reporting period; however, the grades averaged higher at 95.2, compared with 92.1.

U.S. cottonseed production in 1986-87, based on a three year average lint-seed ratio, was forecast at 3.86 million tons as of January 1, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board, NASS, USDA. This was unchanged from the December estimate and 27 percent below the 1985-86 production of 5.28 million tons.

A sharply lower projected cottonseed crush for 1986-87 will result in lower production of cottonseed products, according to the Economic Research Service, USDA. Cottonseed oil production is forecast at 800 million pounds this season. Exports and domestic use of cottonseed oil are projected at 350 and 490 million pounds, respectively. Despite reduced production and use, prices for cottonseed oil are unlikely to change much from 1985-86 levels. Cottonseed oil prices are expected to average between 14 and 18 cents a pound in 1986-87 after posting a 17.6-cent-a-pound average in 1985-86. Large world supplies of vegetable oils are lowering prices, and the cottonseed market appears to be absorbing much of the adjustment.

Cottonseed meal production is placed at 1.15 million short tons in 1986-87, reflecting the steep drop expected in crushings. Domestic use of cottonseed meal is forecast at 1.14 million tons. Prices will likely change little in 1986-87, and if the customary discount with soybean meal is maintained, cottonseed meal prices could average between \$125 and \$150 a ton.

Growers received \$60 to \$125 per ton for cottonseed at the gin during the two weeks ending January 6, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Prices paid for cottonseed used for feeding livestock ranged from \$90 to \$125 in Arizona, New Mexico and Texas. American Pima growers received \$76 to \$100 per ton for cottonseed at the gin. Grade certificates received during the period totaled 753, compared with 654 for the week ending December 23. Cottonseed grades ranged from Below Grade to 111.0, the same as the previous reporting period. However, the grades averaged lower at 92.1 compared with 94.0.

Cottonseed crush is forecast to total only 2.5 million short tons in 1986-87, according to the Economic Research Service, USDA. The drop from 3.42 million tons in 1985-86, reflects more than declining supplies of cottonseed. Low prices for cottonseed oil, combined with heightened interest in direct cottonseed feeding to dairy cattle, have led to a large decrease in crush. Cottonseed feeding in 1986-87 is expected to be down slightly at 1.6 million tons compared with 1.9 million tons in 1985-86.

Cottonseed stocks are expected to decline to a less burdensome 150,000 short tons by seasons' end. Unfortunately, prices are expected to remain low, averaging about \$70 a ton during 1986-87. The cottonseed price is being strongly affected by the generally abundant supply of other oilseeds and slowly-growing demand for oilseed products.

Receipts of cottonseed decreased as harvesting and ginning were completed in most areas of the Cotton Belt by the week ended December 23, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Georgia, Oklahoma, New Mexico and the Rolling Plains of Texas were the only areas that were not at least 95 percent or more complete. The harvesting efforts in these areas were being hampered by extremely wet field conditions. The next Cottonseed Review report will be published January 7.

Cottonseed prices received by growers at the gin ranged from \$50 to \$125 per ton. Prices paid for cottonseed used for cattle feed ranged from \$75 to \$125 in south central and southwestern states, and \$90 to \$170 in western states. American Pima growers were paid \$86 to \$96 per ton for cottonseed at the gin. Grade certificates received during the period totaled 654, compared with 1,025 from a week ago. Cottonseed grades ranged from Below Grade to 111.0 and averaged 94.0, down from 96.5 a week earlier.

Cottonseed production in 1986 fell to 4.0 million short tons, after two seasons of better than 5-million-ton crops, according to Economic Research Service, USDA. Yields were at record highs in 1984 and 1985, but were closer to the long-run trend in 1986 at 0.44 ton per acre. An attractive cotton acreage reduction program helped push acreage below 10 million for only the second time in 10 years. Consequently cottonseed supplies will be 24 percent below 1985-86.

Growers received \$50 to \$125 per ton for cottonseed at the gin during the week ended December 16, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Prices paid for cottonseed used for cattle feed ranged from \$120 to \$135 in southeastern states, \$75 to \$125 in south central and southwestern states and \$90 to \$170 in western states. American Pima growers were paid \$76 to \$100 per ton for cottonseed at the gin. Grade certificates received during the period totaled 1,025, compared with 1,132 a week earlier. Cottonseed grades ranged from Below Grade to 113.5 and averaged 96.5, down from 97.1 a week ago.

U.S. cottonseed production in 1986-87, based on a three year average lint-seed ratio, was forecast at 3.86 million tons as of December 1, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board, NASS, USDA. This compares with the November estimate of 3.90 million tons and was 27 percent below the 1985-86 production of 5.28 million tons.

Growers received \$50 to \$125 per ton for cottonseed at the gin during the week ended December 9, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Prices paid for cottonseed used for cattle feed ranged from \$120 to \$135 in southeastern states, \$80 to \$120 in south central and southwestern states and \$90 to \$142 in western states. American Pima growers were paid \$86 to \$100 per ton for cottonseed at the gin. Grade certificates received during the period totaled 1,132, an increase from 914 a week ago. Cottonseed grades ranged from Below Grade to 114.0 and averaged 97.1 compared with 96.3 a week earlier.

World oilseed production is forecast at 197.2 million metric tons in 1986-87, according to the Economic Research Service, USDA. This compares with 195.8 million metric tons in 1985-86 and 190.9 million metric tons in 1984-85. Total oilseed crush should reach 155.9 million metric tons in 1986-87 against 154.3 million metric tons in 1985-86. Ending stocks of oilseeds will rise from 26.3 million metric tons in 1985-86 to 29.7 million metric tons in 1986-87.

Growers received \$46 to \$125 per ton for cottonseed at the gin during the week ended December 2, according to the Cotton Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Prices paid for cottonseed used for livestock feeding ranged from \$120 to \$135 in southeastern states, \$80 to \$112 in south central states, \$100 to \$120 in southwestern states and \$90 to \$142 in western states. American Pima growers received around \$96 per ton for cottonseed. Grade certificates received during the period totaled 914, compared to 480 a week earlier. Cottonseed grades ranged from 40.5 to 112.0 and averaged 96.3, up from 93.2 a week ago.

Production of crude cottonseed oil totaled 62,190,000 pounds in October 1986, up from 54,531,000 pounds produced in September, according to the Bureau of the Census. Stocks of crude oil at oil mill locations at the end of October were 15,040,000 pounds, up 26 percent from 11,927,000 pounds at the end of September. Production of cottonseed cake and meal totaled 91,227 tons, up from 77,676 tons in September. Stocks of cake and meal declined in October to 49,628 tons from 68,551 tons in September.

Gin yard prices paid to growers for cottonseed were steady to slightly higher and ranged from \$50 to \$125 per ton, mostly \$60 to \$100. Harvesting and ginning were about 98 percent completed in the Mid-South and cottonseed prices were not reported. Prices paid for cottonseed for cattle feed ranged from \$80 to \$130 per ton in southern and southwestern states and \$90 to \$142 per ton in Arizona and California. American Pima cotton growers received \$92 to \$100 per ton for cottonseed. Cottonseed grade certificate receipts were lower and totaled 480 compared with 770 a week ago. Cottonseed grades ranged from 50.0 to 112.5 and averaged 93.2 compared with 91.5 a week earlier.

Cottonseed receipts at oil mills totaled 874,000 tons in October compared with 934,000 tons a year earlier and 835,000 tons two years ago. Cumulative receipts, through October this season, totaled 1,317,000 tons against 1,519,000 tons last season and 1,083,000 tons in 1984. Oil mills crushed 200,000 tons of cottonseed during October compared with 338,000 tons a year earlier and 274,000 tons two years ago. Through October this season, crushings at oil mills totaled 509,000 tons, down from 730,000 tons last year, but up from 417,000 tons two years earlier. Oil mills had 1,155,000 tons of cottonseed on hand at the end of October, down slightly from 1,196,000 tons in 1985 but almost 50 percent more than the stocks on hand in 1984.

Cottonseed prices received by growers at the gin were steady and ranged from \$46 to \$120 per ton, mostly \$60 to \$100. Prices paid for cottonseed for cattle feed ranged from \$80 to \$130 per ton in southern states, \$90 to \$120 per ton in Texas, and \$90 to \$142 per ton in Arizona and California. American Pima cotton growers received \$92 to \$96 per ton for cottonseed. Cottonseed grade certificate receipts were lower and totaled 770 compared with 1,179 a week earlier. Cottonseed grades ranged from 59.5 to 110.0 and averaged 91.5 compared with 93.7 a week ago.

U.S. production of refined cottonseed oil totaled 48,610,000 pounds in September 1986, down from 60,289,000 pounds in August, according to the Bureau of the Census. Consumption of both edible and inedible products totaled 46,850,000 pounds for September. During September, 29,569,000 pounds were used in salad or cooking oil and 11,859,000 pounds were used in baking or frying fats. The total cottonseed oil stocks at the end of September were 89,785,000 pounds, including 54,336,000 pounds of refined oil and 35,449,000 pounds of crude oil.

Prices paid growers for cottonseed at the gin were slightly higher and ranged from \$46 to \$125 per ton, mostly \$60 to \$100. Prices paid for cottonseed for cattle feed ranged from \$65 to \$130 per ton in southern states and \$85 to \$135 per ton in the Far West. American Pima cotton growers received \$90 to \$96 per ton for cottonseed. Cottonseed grade certificates totaled 1,179 compared with 1,199 a week ago. Cottonseed grades ranged from 48.5 to 107.0 and averaged lower at 93.7 compared with 94.2 a week earlier.

U.S. cottonseed production in 1986-87, based on a three year average lint-seed ratio, was forecast at 3.90 million tons as of November 1, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board, National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Gin yard prices to growers for cottonseed were generally steady and ranged from \$46 to \$130 per ton, mostly \$50 to \$100. Prices paid by dairies and cattle feeders were about unchanged and ranged from \$65 to \$120 per ton in southern states and \$85 to \$135 per ton in the Far West. Growers of American Pima cotton received \$76 to \$96 per ton for cottonseed. Cottonseed grade certificate receipts increase slightly and totaled 1,199 compared with 1,096 a week earlier. Cottonseed grades ranged from 71.5 to 110.0 and averaged 94.2 compared with 94.3 a week ago.

The October forecast of 1986-87 cottonseed production was 28.6 million metric tons, according to the Foreign Agricultural Service, USDA. This was down 0.2 million tons or less than 1 percent from September's estimate and down 6 percent from last year. The world's largest producers of cottonseed, with 74 percent of the total estimate, were China with 7.1 million tons, USSR with 4.7 million tons, United States with 3.6 million tons, India with 3.5 million tons and Pakistan with 2.3 million tons.

Growers received \$50 to \$122 per ton for cottonseed at the gin, mostly \$50 to \$100. Prices paid for cottonseed used for livestock feeding ranged from \$65 to \$120 per ton with the higher prices generally being paid in the southeastern states. Cottonseed grade certificates received during the week totaled 2,395 compared with 2,145 a week earlier. Cottonseed grades ranged from 59.0 to 107.5 and averaged 94.4. A week ago the average grade was 96.1.

World oilseed production and crush are both projected to rise modestly during 1986-87 while trade is likely to remain about the same as last year, according to the Economic Research Service, USDA. The global 1986-87 oilseed crop is expected to total a record 197.5 million metric tons, about 1 percent above 1985-86. Total oilseed crush should reach 157.2 million metric tons in 1986-87 compared with 153.8 million metric tons in 1985-86. Ending stocks of oilseeds will rise from 26.5 million metric tons in 1985-86 to 29.5 million metric tons in 1986-87.

Cottonseed production in the United States for 1986, based on a three year average lint-seed ratio is forecast at 3.95 million tons, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board, National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. This is slightly more than 25 percent below the 1985 production of 5.28 million tons.

Cottonseed production will decline in 1986-87 because of reduced acreage and lower prices, respectively, according to the National Economics Division, Economic Research Service, USDA. Conditions in the U.S. vegetable oils market suggest cottonseed oil demand will be up slightly from 1985-86. The decline in cottonseed production will be absorbed almost entirely by a decline in direct cottonseed use, prompted by the Dairy Termination Program and ample supplies of alternative protein feeds. Prices are likely to remain close to 1985-86 levels.

Cottonseed receipts at oil mills totaled 118,000 tons during the month of August, according to the Bureau of the Census. This was down from 191,000 tons last season but up from 86,000 tons in 1984. Crushings during August totaled 141,000 tons compared with 195,000 last year and 70,000 two years ago. At the end of August, stocks of cottonseed at oil mills totaled 323,000 tons, down almost 20 percent from 1985 but about one and one-half times more than 1984.

Prices received by farmers for cottonseed averaged \$56.00 per ton in mid-September, according to the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. This compares with \$59.00 per ton a month earlier and \$57.00 per ton in September 1985.

Cottonseed oil production for 1986-87 is forecast at 1,055 million pounds, according to the National Economics Division, Economic Research Service, USDA. Beginning stocks are estimated to be 120 million pounds. The total projected supply of cottonseed oil for 1986-87 is 1,175 million pounds. Domestic consumption of cottonseed oil is forecast at 700 million pounds and exports are estimated at 375 million pounds for a total disappearance of 1,075 million pounds for 1986-87.

World production of cottonseed is estimated at 28.7 million tons, according to the Foreign Production Estimates Division, FAS, USDA. This is down 0.3 million or 1 percent from last month and down 5 percent from last year.

After two seasons of near half-ton yields per acre, a projected cut in acreage will reduce cottonseed production in the U. S. in 1986-87, according to the National Economics Division, Economic Research Service, USDA. Total planted cotton acreage is estimated at 9.67 million. The acreage reduction program should idle the most marginal land, so yields should remain stable. If projected yields are realized, production will reach 4.27 million tons in 1986-87. Combined with a slightly lower expected carryover of 300,000 tons, 1986-87 supplies would total 4.57 million tons, a 20 percent fall from 1985-86.

The forecast decline in supplies will be absorbed primarily through reduced direct feeding of cottonseed, which is expected to decline to 1.1 million tons in 1986-87 from 1.9 million in 1985-86. The loss can be partly attributed to the Dairy Termination Program and a rise in domestic soybean meal disappearance. Cottonseed crush is projected at 3.3 million tons in 1986-87, down from 3.5 million in 1985-86. Stocks could be down to 150,000 tons by season's end, and prices are expected to be near the \$65 average reported in 1985-86.
