CHARGES FOR GINNING COTTON, COSTS OF SELECTED SERVICES INCIDENT TO MARKETING, AND RELATED INFORMATION, 1977/78 SEASON

Ginning charges.--The average charge for saw ginning and wrapping a 480-pound net-weight bale of upland cotton in the United States was \$34.73 during the 1977/78 season, an increase of \$1.86 over the 1976/77 season. Average charges varied from \$27.03 in Alabama to \$39.50 in New Mexico. Total per bale charges were up in 11 States and decreased in 3. Increases ranged from \$4.97 in Oklahoma to 8 cents in Georgia. Charges for bagging and ties were down from \$10.07 to \$9.82--a decrease of 25 cents. After showing the greatest decrease in ginning charges in 1976/77, Oklahoma charges rose in 1977/78 by practically the same amount as the decrease of the previous year. Charges for ginning American-Pima cotton increased \$4.05 per bale.

Total production of upland was up 3,670,816 bales from 1976/77, but production declined in all States comprising the Southeast cotton region of the United States. American-Pima production increased by 45,751 bales. The number of active gins for the 1977/78 season was 2,689 compared with 2,771 in 1976/77 and 2,857 in 1975/76.

Method of harvesting.--Less than 1 percent of the 1977/78 crop was hand-picked or hand-snapped. There was a slight increase in the amount of cotton machine-stripped this season, accounted for primarily by an increase of machine-stripped cotton in New Mexico. Cotton ginned from modules and ricks increased from 9 percent in 1976/77 to 17 percent in 1977/78.

Pounds of seed required for a 480-pound net-weight bale.--There was a slight increase in the amount of seed cotton required for a 480-pound bale of hand-picked and machine-picked cotton. However, for hand-snapped, machine-stripped, and machine-scrapped cotton, there was a decrease of 77, 74, and 75 pounds, respectively.

Purchases of cotton by ginners.--Growers sold 12 percent of their crop to ginners as bale lint-only about one-half the amount of last year. Less than 1 percent of production was purchased by ginners as seed cotton.

Selected services incident to marketing. -- Average receiving charge increased 2 cents a bale to \$1.56. Average storage charge increased 7 cents a bale a month to \$1.06 for cotton not under Government loan or acquired by the Commodity Credit Corporation. Compression charge averaged \$4.26 for universal density, an increase of 34 cents.
