The 1990 figures in this report are subject to revision.

Individual state data, as shown, will not add to the United States totals because of (D)'s. The (D) data for Florida and Kansas are 25,510 bales and are included in the United States total. The Upland data for Alabama, Florida, and Kansas are 398,789 bales and are included in the Upland and United States totals. The American Pima data for Alabama and Florida are 200 bales and are included in the American Pima and United States totals.

Cotton consumed during November amounted to 615,045 bales. Cotton on hand in consuming establishments on November 24, 1990, was 519,544 bales, and in public storage and in compresses 8,798,771 bales; the number of active consuming cotton spindles was 3,810,000. There were no cotton imports during October. Exports of domestic cotton, excluding linters, were 329,000 bales. These and other data were published in Census Bulletin 90-230, M22P(91)-4, dated December 21, 1990.
