





Presidential Scholarships are awarded to entering first-time freshman who show exceptional academic ability through superior test scores and class ranking. Annual award amounts pay one-half toward fall and one-half toward spring terms. They are guaranteed, provided you are admitted prior to April 15th. Complete admissions requirements early as scholarship awards may be limited after April 15th.

#### NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS




