## DO YOU QUALIFY?

- Top 50% with SAT 1500 or ACT 33
- Top 40% with SAT 1400 or ACT 30
- Top 30% with SAT 1300 or ACT 28
- Top 20% with SAT 1200 or ACT 25

Presidential Scholarships are awarded to entering first-time freshman who show exceptional academic ability through superior test scores and class ranking. Annual award amounts pay one-half toward fall and one-half toward spring terms. They are guaranteed, provided you are admitted prior to April 15th. Complete admissions requirements early as scholarship awards may be limited after April 15th.

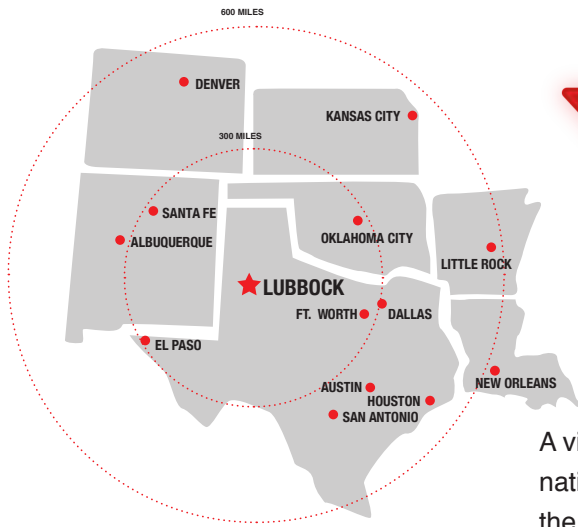
