## Questions to answer ahead of class in writing

- 1. Who is Matthew Scully? What jobs has he had of significance?
- 2. What is Scully's basic argument about animals used by humans?
- 3. How does he deal with the Utilitarian and Rights views of animal treatment?
- 4. What does he say about farm animals and their treatment?
  - a. Cite text in which he is anthropomorphic or sensational
  - b. Give examples of where he is factually incorrect
- 5. Do you agree or disagree with his interpretation of the Bible and animal treatment?

## Questions for in-class discussion

- 1. Compare the views of Peter Singer and Matthew Scully. Is Matthew Scully a Utilitarian? Does Matthew Scully believe in Animal Rights?
- 2. Compare the anthropomorphism in *The Jungle* with *Dominion*
- 3. What do you think was the reaction of senior staff at Smithfield Foods to publication of *Dominion*?
- 4. Scully states (p. 269): "Moral disengagement on this scale requires moral disengagement at every stage..." Do you agree with this statement? Are animal production companies morally engaged in animal welfare?
- 5. Scully talks a lot about individual animals and their wounds and sores and injuries. Are wounds and injuries an on-farm animal welfare problem?
- 6. Can people who manage farm animals day-to-day become callous to animal welfare?
- 7. What do you think of the move away from Husbandry (our department used to be called Animal Husbandry) and towards Science. Was this a good change? Are the terms mutually exclusive?
