

TEXAS TECH UNIVERSITY (Organic Chemistry) The Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry invites applications for a tenure-track, open rank faculty position. Research interest is welcomed in any area of **Organic Chemistry**, broadly defined. A Ph.D. is required; postdoctoral experience is preferred. Senior candidates are expected to possess a distinguished academic record and a successful, externally funded and nationally recognized research program; junior candidates are expected to develop such a research program. All candidates must have a commitment to excellence in research, service, and teaching at the undergraduate and graduate levels. Texas Tech University is classified as a doctoral research-extensive university by the Carnegie Foundation, has an enrollment of *ca.* 33,000 students, and is one of the major, state-supported, multidisciplinary universities of the Southwest. Texas Tech offers 104 masters and 57 doctoral programs, with Schools of Medicine and Law located on the main campus in Lubbock. Within the University, the Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry, with 27 tenure-track faculty positions, is among the top academic units in terms of research funding, publications and graduate education.

Evaluation of applications will begin immediately and continue until the position is filled.
