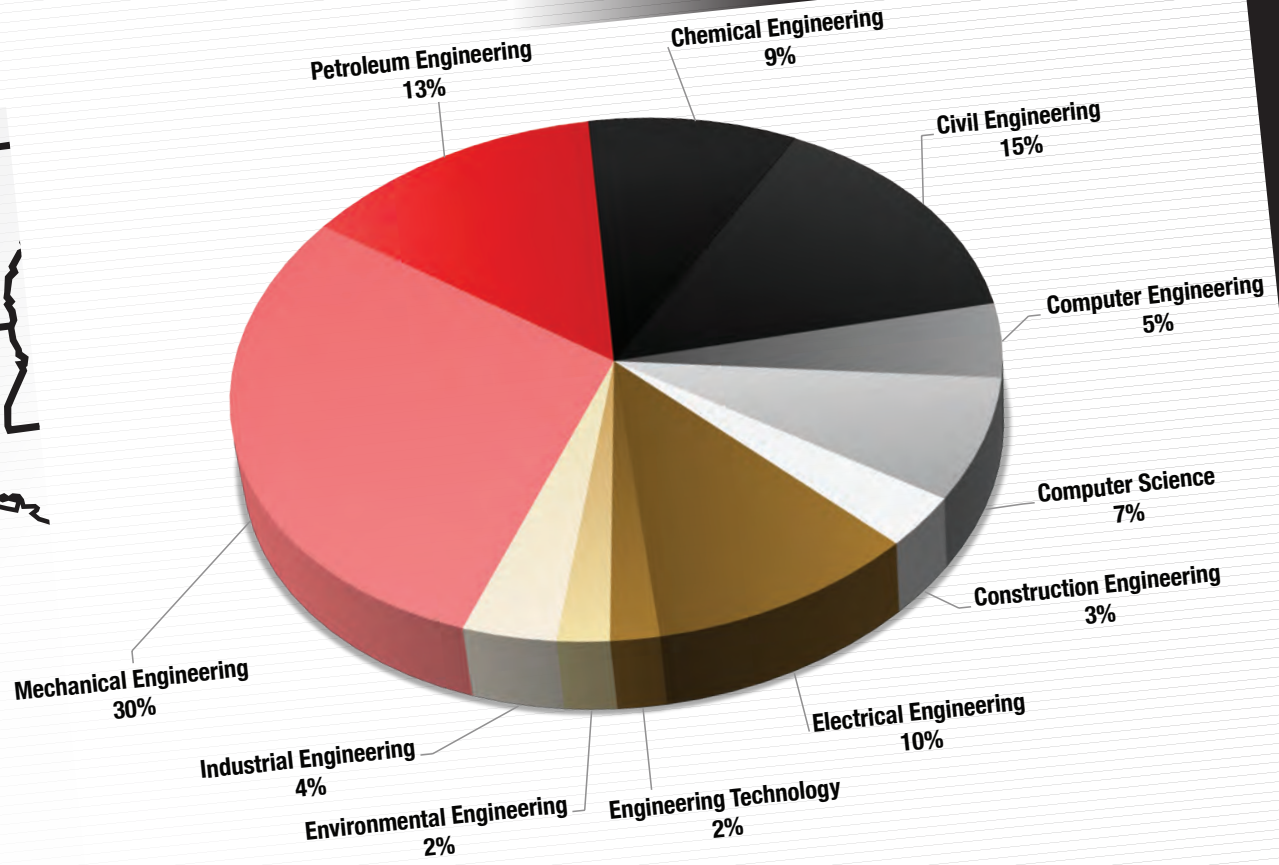

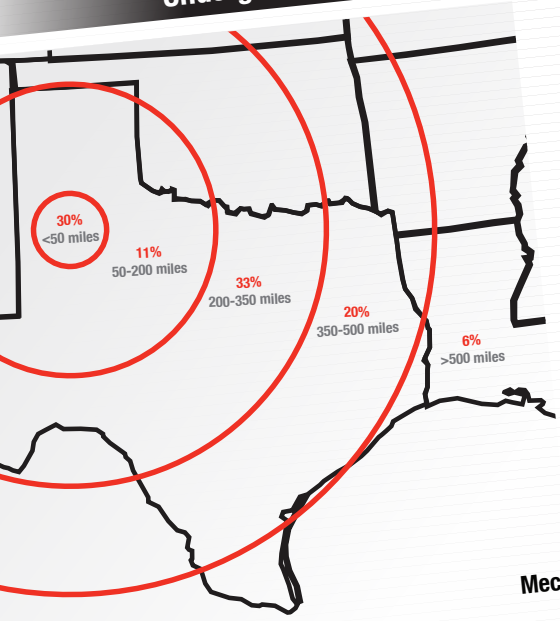
STUDENTS BY AGE

Enrollment by Academic Area of Study

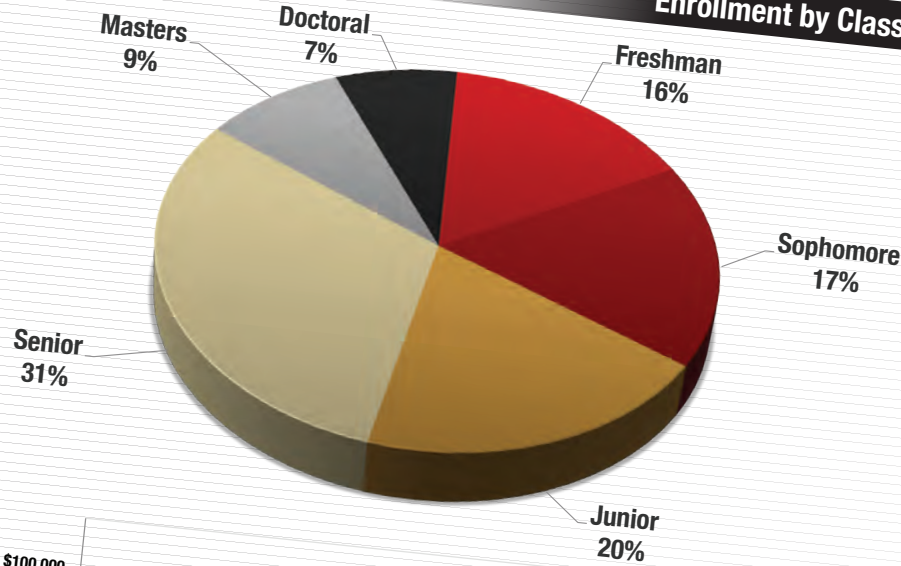


Undergraduate Residency
