



All new and returning school counselors and advisors complete recent, high-quality training specific to their role in effective advising service delivery on an annual basis.

School counseling program staff evaluations are managed by a qualified campus leader who is well-versed in school counseling and advising responsibilities. Whenever possible, it is recommended that evaluations are completed by someone who has been a certified school counselor or is trained in effective advising and the Texas Model for Comprehensive School Counseling.
