		1) Graduate School Application 2) Official Transcripts 3) Official copy of the TOEFL scores (for international students) 4) GRE scores 5) History Department Application 6) Three referees 7) Statement of purpose 8) Writing sample such as thesis chapter, research paper, etc. A student qualifying for admission to the Graduate School may gain admission to the department's doctoral program by meeting the following standards: 9) Possession of a master's degree which includes at least 18 hours of course work in history. 10) An overall grade-point average in all graduate work of 3.50. 11) Students must take the Graduate Record Examination. Generally speaking, students accepted into the program have scores ranging from 500 to 650 on the Verbal Section of the examination, and scores ranging from 450 to 600 on the mathematical section of the examination. In no case will GRE scores serve by themselves as a sufficient criterion for acceptance or rejection.
