- **3301 Ancient Civilizations I:** Introduction to the study of ancient Near East and classical Greece. (Forsythe, MWF, 3:00) *Advanced EUR History Category*
- **3308 U.S. Foreign Relations to 1913:** A survey of U.S. foreign relations from the American Revolution to 1913 with an emphasis on the evolution of the U.S. as a world power. (Powers Useche, MWF, 12:00) *Advanced US History Category*
- **3325 History of Mexican-Americans in the U.S.:** Survey of the history of Mexican Americans of the United States during the 20th century, relating their daily life and institutional experience to United States and Mexican history. (Levario, T/Th, 11:00) *Advanced US History*
- **3329 Development of Modern Science:** Examines the historical development of the intellectual, institutional, and social dimensions of European science from the 17th century to the present. (Baum, T/Th, 11:00) *Advanced EUR History Category*
- **3345 The Birth of Europe:** Examines the confrontation between the Later Roman Empire and its barbarian invaders, which ultimately produced new economic, political, social, and cultural structures of a new civilization. (Howe, MWF, 11:00) *Advanced EUR History Category*
- **3347 Colonial North America:** This course surveys political, social, and cultural changes in colonial North America from the arrival of Europeans to the eve of the American Revolution. (Moore, MWF, 2:00) *Advanced US History Category*
- **3355 Europe in Transformation, 1815-1914:** Transformations in the social, cultural, political, and economic structures of Europe during the 19th century. Revolution, nationalism, industrialism, and mass culture. (Legacey, T/Th, 12:30) *Advanced EUR History Category*
- **3367 Second World War:** A history of the major diplomatic, military, social, and economic developments associated with the Second World War. (Bell, T, 6:00-8:50) *Advanced EUR History*
- **3374 History of Soviet and Post-Soviet Russia:** Russian history from the revolutions of 1917 to the present, emphasizing the Soviet state's internal development, role in international relations, and collapse. (Barenberg, MWF, 10:00) *Advanced EUR History Category*
- **3383 Modern Mexico and Central America:** Covers major themes in Mexico and Central America since Independence. (Brittsan, T/Th, 9:30) *Advanced AAL History Category*
- **4302 Era of the American Revolution:** An exploration of the causes, progress, and consequences of the American Revolution as both a domestic and global event from 1750-1820. (Adams, MWF, 10:00) *Advanced US History Category*

- **4309 United States and the Cold War:** Examines the causes, course, and consequences of the Cold War between the U.S. and the Soviet Union. (Verrone, T/Th, 11:00)

- **4310 United States Foreign Relations through Film:** A study of major issues in modern U.S. foreign relations as presented and interpreted through film. (Hart, W, 3:00-5:50)

- **4334 Race and Medicine in American History:** This course introduces students to the history of race, medicine, science, and health in American history. (Kretz, T/Th, 12:30)

- **4353 The French Revolution and Napoleon:** The Old Regime and the Enlightenment. The Revolution and its drama, ideas, events, personalities, and complexities. Napoleon: heir, paladin, or liquidator of the Revolution? (Legacey, T/Th, 3:30) *Advanced EUR History Category*
- **4359 Cultural Brilliance and Political Failure: Germany's Weimar Republic, 1919-1933:** Surveys the origins and demise of the Weimar period of German history. (Lutjens, MWF, 1:00) *Advanced EUR History Category*
- **4373: Tudor-Stuart England, 1450-1688:** Deals with enormous and seminal changes (religious, political, constitutional, intellectual, and geographical) that took place in England from 1450 to 1688. (Bell, T/Th, 2:00) *Advanced EUR History Category*
- **4382 Walking the Line: The History of U.S.-Mexico Border Relations since 1836:** A research course that covers the social, political, and economic histories of specific borderland region between the United States and Mexico. **Fulfills multicultural requirement.** (Powers Useche, MWF, 2:00) *Advanced US History Category*
- **4395 Modern Vietnam:** Covers the social, political, and cultural history of Vietnam, beginning with the emergence of frontier society in the 16th century and concluding with the Vietnamese diaspora. (Pelley, T/Th, 3:30) *Advanced AAL History Category*
- **4398 - Senior Seminar in History:** Required of history majors. An intensive study in historical methodology, document analysis, retrieval and collection of data, and synthesis into well-written history.
