

Tracking Sheet for students pursuing prereqs for possible transfer to TTUHSC Health Professions/School of Nursing 24-Hour Requirement

The School of Health Professions and the School of Nursing offer the Honors designation for a bachelor's degree in Nursing (NURS); Clinical Lab Science (CLS); and Speech, Language, and Hearing Sciences (SLHS). If Honors requirements are complete before matriculation into the TTUHSC, students may receive the Honors designation on their diploma.

General Honors Coursework (any level) – 18 hours

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First-Year Experience (FYE) course – required in first fall semester.

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Possible courses include, but are not limited to: BIOL 1403, BIOL 1404, CHEM 1305, CHEM 1307, CHEM 1308, CHEM 3305, CHEM 3306, COMS 2358, HIST 2300, HIST 2301, HONS 1301, HONS 1302, HONS 1304, MATH 2300, MUHL 1308, MUSI 1300, PHYS 1408, PHYS 2401, POLS 2306, PSY 1300, and THA 2301. Students may also substitute up to 6 hours of general Honors credit through contracting or completing a Study Abroad/Study Away Waiver. *While these suggested course options have been frequently offered as Honors in past semesters, they are subject to change and are not guaranteed Honors offerings.*

3000-Level Honors Seminar – 3 hours

4000-Level Honors Seminar – 3 hours

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Only students who transfer to the TTUHSC are eligible to maintain Honors from the TTU Honors College; it is required that all 24 Honors credits be complete before matriculating to the TTUHSC.

Additional information can be found at <u>www.honors.ttu.edu</u>. Honors Upper-Level Seminar courses (3000/4000-level) can be taken at any time, regardless of major or classification, unless a particular course description states otherwise.

Completion of these 24 credit hour course requirements allows a student to graduate With Honors.

In addition, students may apply to complete 6 additional credit hours specifically through the Honors Thesis Program (HONS 3300 and 4300), culminating in a written thesis and graduation With Highest Honors.
