- ❖ Studies in Personal Finance provides basic knowledge needed to manage personal financial activities in day-to-day life. It is appropriate preparation for those who want to work in social services, education, communications, and other settings where this basic knowledge will be valuable. This concentration will NOT satisfy eligibility requirements to sit for the Certified Financial Planner Comprehensive Exam.
- ❖ All PFP courses must be completed with a grade of “C” or higher.
- ❖ Students who are nearing graduation and who have a good academic record may want to consider applying for the graduate program in Personal Financial Planning rather than extending their undergraduate degree. The MS degree requires 42 graduate hours, with the possibility of 3 leveling courses for students who have not taken Accounting, Business Law, and Statistics at the undergraduate level.
