### INTERIOR DESIGN 3325/SPRING 2012

**Class:** Elective course, 3 hours credit, class meets weekly all semester. ID 3325 is a seminar class that researches the design of a designated city and includes a field trip to Chicago, Illinois (7 days) over Spring Break.  
**Class size limited to 40 students, no pre-requisites required.**

**Cost:** Tuition for a 3 hour class, plus a Special Field Trip Fee: **\$975.00**. The trip fee, (paid at the time of registration) includes: lodging in Chicago, Illinois (6 nights), many special tours, and celebration dinners in Chicago.

**Airfare:** Students are to purchase their individual plane tickets  
Note: cost of airfare is not included in the trip fee for the class. Copy of ticket to be presented 2nd week of class.

**Trip:** Six nights lodging on the "Magnificent Mile" in Chicago

A day at the Art Institute of Chicago and walking tours of historic Chicago architecture and interiors.

A day of Frank Lloyd Wright interiors and architecture.

A visit to the Chicago Merchandise Mart to see the finest furniture showrooms in the world.

Appointments to visit Chicago design firms and an evening "networking party" with design professionals.

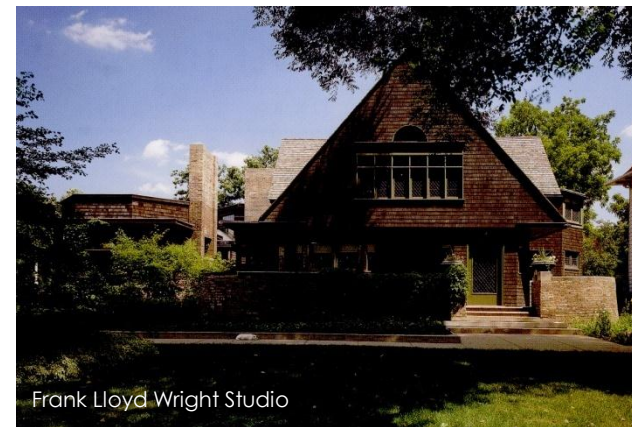
Investigation into "Green Design" the Chicago way.

Free time for the "Chicago Experience" and much more.

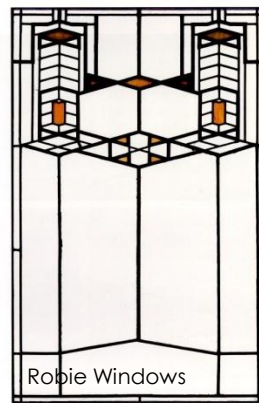

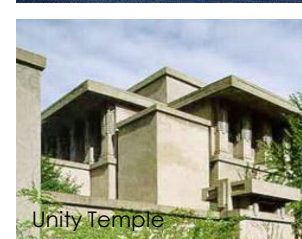
