This plan assumes that the student is exempt from any additional foreign language requirement for the University Core. The last 30 hours of the degree MUST be completed at TTU.

NSCD is a six semester sequenced curriculum. Courses must be taken in sequence as indicated by the pre-requisites and semester offered. Acceptance into the Didactic Program in Dietetics (DPD) at the junior level is based on overall 3.0 GPA, 3.0 GPA in NS courses, and 2.0 GPA in CHEM & ZOOL courses.
