This summer, let your kids experience a **STEM**/Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (**TEKS**) combination of *Learning* and *Adventure* at the **Texas Tech University Outdoor School (OS).**

Your camper will be taught by certified OS Staff and Natural Resource Professionals through engaging hands-on learning and outdoor recreation.

- * plant identification * composting
- * hiking * tubing
- * bird identification
- * kayaking
- * water sampling
- * cast a fishing rod
- * wildlife tracking
- * low ropes

Cost: \$500.00 per camper (Includes all activities, food, and lodging.)

Roundtrip transportation provided from Lubbock.

To hold your spot in camp, fill out the **2018 Summer Camp Registration / Permission Form** and send it in with your **\$100 registration fee**. (The \$100 registration fee is non-refundable unless there is a medical reason, which requires a letter from your doctor.) Once received, we will e-mail a confirmation letter to you with a reminder of your balance and date due.

** The camp balance is due in full by June 22, 2018 (30 days prior to arrival). **

Red Raider Discount:

Take advantage of our **Red Raider Discount** and save \$50.00 when you sign up by May 1, 2018.

Refund Policy:

If you need to cancel, contact us at least **30 days** prior to arrival at camp to receive a full refund less the \$100 non-refundable registration fee. Otherwise no refund.

Expectations:

On the first day of camp, each camper will attend orientation that includes behavior expectations and safety rules. We will emphasize Student Behavior Guidelines (attached). Our goal is to create an atmosphere where campers feel comfortable, are ready to get up each day to learn new things, and establish lifelong friendships.

All staff members are trained to handle behavior problems through positive reinforcement, redirection, and if needed, age appropriate consequences.

Summer Camp Student Behavior Guidelines

Rights and Expectations:

We believe all students have the right to a quality outdoor experience. We also believe, as teachers, we are entitled to instruct students without interruptions due to inappropriate student behavior. By signing below, you are stating that you and your child have read and understand the following guidelines, consequences and procedures.

Guidelines for Students:

- T Will be attentive and participate in all activities to the best ofmy ability.
- Will respect the rights of others, and their property.
- Will respect the Texas Tech Outdoor School (OS) property.
- Will not curse, use vulgar language, horseplay, bully, or fight other campers.
- Will not litter, and only put trash in containers provided (inside and out).
- Will be sure to take someone with me wherever I go, unless told otherwise by staff.
- Will only use activity areas during allotted times, supervised by OSstaff.
- Can use mobile phones only at designated times approved by OSstaff.
- Tunderstands that non-compliance of guidelines could mean automatic dismissal.

Consequences and Procedures:

- Students will receive a verbal warning.
- If misbehavior continues, parents/guardians will be notified, student will lose their right to participate in activities, and possibly sent home.
- **T** Campers will be dismissed immediately with no refund for:
 - Physical assault of another person
 - Damage, destruction, or theft of personal or university property
 - Sexual encounter
 - Misuse of university computers
 - Possession of alcohol, tobacco products, illegal drugs, fireworks, or any sort of weapon (including firearm or knife)
 - Bullying
 - Any other behavior that the Director deems harmful or unsafe to the camp

The Texas Tech University Outdoor School (OS) is devoted to creating innovative educational programs. We provide a setting where students become engaged in the natural world and discover the joy of learning. We immerse learners in authentic, hands-on activities that stimulate imagination, develop a curiosity about life, and create an environment where we share discoveries.

Certified teachers and staff work to monitor and care for your child for the duration of their stay.

Why should your child go to the OS Summer Camp?

- T Summer Camp provides your child with meaningful time to learn science.
- Summer Camp has a variety of environmental programs that meet state educational standards, incorporate outdoor recreational activities, and help develop leadership qualities through teamwork activities.

Students attend Summer Camp for 3 nights / 4 days. During this stay, they will become Scientists, Astronomers, Ecologists, Ornithologists, Aquatic Biologists, and Nature Explorers. They will collect and record data using the scientific method throughout their stay.

Will my child receive excellent care?

- Tacilities are kept very clean and dorms are climate controlled for comfort.
- T Meals are nutritious and served by certified food handlers in the university cafeteria.
- Instructors will ensure campers get their rest and are properly cared for with any special health concerns such as allergies, diet, medication, or sleepwalking. All personal matters are kept confidential.

Clothes and Equipment

PLEASE label everything with your child's name. Students will be spending a lot of time outdoors, so they need to be prepared for all types of weather. Please help them pack clothes that are rugged and informal.

Bedding – pack bedding in a plastic bag so that it stays clean and dry.

- Pillow with pillowcase
- Sleeping bag or sheet and blanket

Clothing and Personal Items

- Enough clothing for the scheduled days, plus one extra outfit
- Long pants: jeans or other rugged pants
- Shorts: use of shorts will be limited by activity
- Sweatshirt, windbreaker, or jacket
- Extra socks in a zippered bag for the river
- Closed-toe, durable shoes (No flip-flops, crocs, or sandals, please)
- Sleepwear (shorts are acceptable as sleepwear)
- Extra shoes that can be used in the river (No flip-flops, crocs, or sandals)

Shower Needs

- Toiletry items: deodorant, soap, toothpaste, toothbrush, comb/brush, etc.
- Washcloth and towel
- Optional: shower shoes or *flip-flops* may only be worn for showering

Other Needs

- Rain gear or poncho (justin case)
- Insect repellent
- Sunscreen and lip balm
- Disposable camera (make sure it is labeled with student name)
- Hat/Visor and sunglasses
- Plastic bag for dirty/wet clothes
- Optional items
 - o Flashlight
 - Letter writing materials (stamp, envelope, paper)

Please do NOT bring:

- Curling Irons, Flat irons, or hair dryers (we will provide hair dryers if needed)
- Electronics: handheld game devices, CD players, iPods, iPads, etc.
- Food (including candy and gum) or soft drinks
- Pocket knives or other sharp objects
- Make-up, jewelry, nail polish, perfume
- Large amounts of money

Directions to Texas Tech University Outdoor School Junction, Texas

From San Antonio:

Take I-10 West to Junction exit 460. Follow Loop 481 toward Junction. Turn left on Ranch Road 2169. Follow 2169 to the stop sign at Flatrock Road. The entrance to the OS is in front of you.

From Austin/Fredericksburg:

Take 290 West to I-10 West. Take I-10 West to Junction exit 460. Follow Loop 481 toward Junction. Turn left on Ranch Road 2169. Follow 2169 to the stop sign at Flatrock Road. The entrance to the OS is in front of you.

From Rocksprings:

Take 377 North toward Junction. Approximately 5 miles past the South Llano River State Park, turn right on Flatrock Road and follow to the stop sign. The entrance to the OS is on your right.

From Sonora:

Take I-10 East to Junction Exit 456. Follow 83/377 South (N Main St.) into Junction. At the 377 South intersection (across from Lowes Market), turn right at that light. Turn left onto Flatrock Road and follow to the stop sign. The entrance to the OS is on your right.

From Menard/Eden:

Follow 83 South into Junction. Stay on 83/377 South until you come to the 377 South intersection (across from Lowes Market), turn right at that light. Turn left onto Flatrock Road and follow to the stop sign. The entrance to the OS is on your right.

From Brady/Mason:

Take 377 South into Junction. Stay on 83/377 South until you come to the 377 South intersection (across from Lowes Market), turn right at that light. Turn left onto Flatrock Road and follow to the stop sign. The entrance to the OS is on your right.
