ABOUT THE EXAM

The examination is based on the Essential Knowledge and Skills for this subject. Since questions are not taken from any one source, you can prepare by reviewing any of the state-adopted textbooks that are used at your school. If you do not have a textbook or any other study material available locally, you may contact the Outreach & Distance Education Bookstore. The bookstore carries the textbooks used with our English 6B Distance Education course. The textbooks used are *McGraw-Hill English*, by Sulzby, Klein, Teale, and Hoffman (McGraw-Hill, 1990), and *Spelling and Vocabulary*, by Templeton (Houghton Mifflin, 1998).

The CBE consists of 100 multiple-choice questions and a written composition from a prompt covering one of the following types of writing taught in English 6B: “how to,” compare/contrast, and narrative (story). The multiple-choice portion of the test will be worth 75% of your final grade. The other 25% will be the grade you receive from the holistically scored composition. The composition will be scored according to five categories: (1) how well the writer addressed the prompt, (2) elaboration, (3) organization, (4) control of language, and (5) grammar and mechanics (punctuation, capitalization, and sentence structure).

The practice exam on the following pages should give you some idea of the types of questions that you will see on the exam. An answer key is provided at the end of the practice exam.

- A. Many people believe that families are watching too much TV. Other people say there are good points about watching TV. Think about the advantages and disadvantages of watching TV. Write an essay in which you explain both the advantages and the disadvantages of watching TV.
- B. Your next-door neighbor loses his cat. Write an essay in which you tell your neighbor what he can do first to find his cat. Then tell him other steps he can take to find his cat.
- C. As Jon hikes through the woods, he sees a dark cave ahead and decides to investigate. It is cool inside the cave, so he decides to sit on a rock and rest. When he sits down on the rock, it moves! Complete the story.

Write your essay on your own paper. Make the essay long enough to fulfill the basic requirements of a complete, well-written essay. Support each of your ideas and elaborate on all of the important details.
