## **Pre-Medicine Mentoring Program Description**

The pre-medicine mentorship program is a unique experience where a TTU undergraduate student pursuing admission to medical school will be paired with a TTUHSC medical student who will act as a mentor. The mentor/mentee experience will include:

- Each pre-medicine mentee will be paired up with a medical student (either a 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> year medical student) mentor.
- Medical students have 2 different courses each semester with one taken during the first half of the semester and the other taken during the second half. Each participating protégé will attend at least one class of both courses with their mentor on days that work best for the mentee. The mentors are encouraged to take their mentee to more classes if possible.
- Each mentor will take their mentee to one lunch organization meeting.
- The mentors will provide advice about the medical school experience and answer questions the mentee may have.
- All the mentee will need to do is to drive over to the medical school. The mentor will meet the mentee outside and guide him/her through the experience.
