Pre-Occupational Therapy Mentoring Program Description

The pre-occupational therapy mentorship program is a unique experience where a TTU undergraduate student pursuing admission to occupational therapy school will be paired with a TTUHSC occupational therapy student who will act as a mentor. This up-close look at life in an occupational therapy program will allow the pre-occupational therapy student to have confidence in their commitment.

The mentor/mentee experience will include:

- ➤ Each pre-OT mentee will be paired up with an OT student (either a 1st or 2nd year OT student) mentor.
- Each participating mentee will attend two classes with their mentor on days that work best for the mentee and have been approved by the faculty member. The mentee understands that this will be observation only and will not be actively involved in the class work. They will also have the opportunity to attend an anatomy lab tour (one tour set toward the end of the spring semester) or a student association meeting.
- The mentors will provide advice about the OT school experience and answer questions the mentee may have.
- All the mentee will need to do is to drive over to TTUHSC. The mentor will meet the mentee outside and guide him/her through the experience.
- ➤ The mentee understands that participation in this program does not guarantee admission into the TTUHSC School of Allied Health Sciences.
