GRADES 1 - 3

(Grade completed as of May 2007)

★ **Spinning and Weaving** 8:30-10:15 a.m.
Learn to card, spin and dye natural wool, just like early Spanish settlers did to make their own household items. Weave on a simple frame loom to make a cool woven project.

★ **Watercolor Wildflowers** 8:30-10:15 a.m.
Express your artistic side as you study some of the world-famous Texas wildflowers. Learn basic watercolor skills as you paint the colorful plants.

★ **A Day on the Trail** 8:30-10:15 a.m.
Explore the Old West and learn about a typical day in the life of a cowboy. Make your own cowboy gear, choose a job for a cattle drive, practice your roping skills and saddle up your stick horse for a rodeo on the last day of classes.

★ **Cowhide Creations** 10:45 a.m. -12:30 p.m.
Discover the many uses of leather and why it is so important to cowboys and cowgirls. Learn how to braid, lace and stamp leather to make items you can take home.

★ **Pioneer Living** 10:45 a.m.-12:30 p.m.
Learn about the pioneers and how they settled this area. Experience what life was like for a 19th-century child by participating in wash day, attending classes in a one-room school, making pioneer crafts and playing period games.

★ **Where the Deer & the Antelope Play** 10:45 a.m.-12:30 p.m.
Find out about the many varieties of critters that call the South Plains home. Learn how these animals have adapted to life in West Texas. Journey around the grounds at the NRHC to see what animals you can spy.



GRADES 4 - 6

(Grade completed as of May 2007)

★ **Let's Rodeo!** 8:30-10:15 a.m.
Work with an experienced rodeo team to learn about all aspects of the rodeo roundup, such as proper horse care and grooming, saddling up with the right cowboy gear and perfecting your roping skills.

★ **Bullhide, Belts & Buckles** 8:30-10:15 a.m.
Discover the different properties and varieties of leather by learning leatherworking skills such as braiding, lacing, stamping and tooling. Make fun projects you can wear.

★ **Cowboy Cultures** 8:30-10:15 a.m.
The Spanish vaqueros, the French gardians and the Hawaiin paniolos are all cowboys from different cultures. Learn about their rich history by experiencing the traditions, music and lingo of these cowboy cultures.

★ **Wildflowers in Watercolor** 10:45 a.m.-12:30 p.m.
Create colorful landscapes and wildflower portraits as you paint Texas wildflowers using watercolors. Also learn how to use pencil drawing to create your own works of art.

★ **Spinning & Weaving** 10:45 a.m.-12:30 p.m.
Learn to card, spin and dye natural wool, just like early Spanish settlers did to make their own household items. Weave on a simple frame loom to make a really cool woven project.

★ **The Ranch Hand Experience** 10:45 a.m.-12:30 p.m.
