Cosby presented information indicating that from Fiscal 1989 to Fiscal 1990 the library will receive a 15 percent increase in funding.

1. A college which has a tenure track faculty position available must irst make a legitimate offer to a qualified minority, woman or man, depending on which grpup is underrepresented. This requirement will apply so long as that college has an underrepresentation of minorities, women or men, as determined by the University's Affirmative Plan.
2. For those who accept faculty positions under stipulation of Section 1 , relocation assistance will be provided from special funds established for this purpose.
3. Additional funding for faculty salary increases would be provided to colleges that are successful in hiring and retaining a substantiaf number of faculty from minority or underrepresented groups.

These proposed changes will next go to the Provost's Council for approval. Senator stpauss moved that this issue be referred to the proper Senate committee for study and report. With a second the motion passed.

Student Senate - Senator Brink, liaison, reported that he attended a Student Senate meeting and was favorably impressed. The Student senate has addressed such matter 5 as bicycle paths, trash cans around campus, extension of hours fof the campus shuttle, pedestrian crosswalks, and restoration of the dapiry barn. The Student senate voted against press censorship by the Unifed States Senate, which instructs student newspapers not to carry advertising encouraging alcoholic consumption. The senate also discussed plans for student retention and faculty teaching eyaluation.

VI. New Business

Report on facult hiring and resignation/termination:
Whitsitt reported that, according to the minutes of the Board of Regents meeting, Octoper 7, 1989, during the period July 1989 thrqugh September 1989 there were a total of 25 professorial appointments: 2 full professors (one of whom was hired as a dean); 1 associate professor; 6 tenure-track assistant professors; 2 visiting associate professors; 12 visiting assistant professors; 2 adjunct assistant professors. Dyring the same period there wer\& 13 professorial resignations/terminations, including retirements: 5 full professors; 3 associate professors; 4 assistant professors; 1 visitind assistant professor. This indicates, in tenured and tenure-track ranks, a net loss of 3 professors and 2 associate professors, nd a net gain of 2 apsistant professors. In all ranks, however, there has een a net loss of 3 gain of 15 visiting of

Resolution on th $\neq$ invasion of the term paper vendors:

Senator Strauss presented a resolution asking the Faculty Seqate to uphold academic integfity by offering assistance to the university authorities who attempt to stop advertising the sale of term papers. With a second the motion passed.

Discussion of peqquisites given by textbook publishers in requrn for adoptions

President Whitsift reported that Haragan and Goodin expressed concern over rumored kick-backs to faculty members or departments for textbook adoption. Whitsitt referred this matter to Committee $B$ for study

Resolution on refations between faculty and the development office
Questions have b\&en raised regarding how faculty may cooperate with the Development Office. Kathleeen Hennessey presented in writing a resolution regarding this process. It was decided to defer the issue until a White paper can be ssued by the Development Office.
VII. Remarks by Donafd Haragan, Executive Vice President and Proyost

Provost Haragan feported on the formula funding process. The Coordinating Board coptracted with consultants to make recommendations regarding formula funding. The following were their recommendations:

1. The formula funding system should be maintained.
2. Each university should be able to set its own tuition. This is now true for graduate programs.
3. Research should be removed from formula systems. This would impact small schools fore than large universities, although the University of Texas and Texas A\&n are both quite concerned.
4. Mission stayements should be used to determine programs and degree levels to be fynded at various universities. This is already being done.
5. Use incentive
6. Continue lump sum funding.
7. Simplify fornula review process. Institute review by three committees: one for universities, one for community colleges, and one for health sciences centers.

Faculty members gan attend the teleconference on AIDS, November 16, 12:00 to 3:00 p.m.. Hresident Lawless will present ideas for the development of researdh to the Sigma Xi meeting at 12:00, November 16.

Provost Haragan said that we are not satisfied with our funding through the Advanced Hesearch Program (ARP) and Advanced Technical Research Program (ART) although we received more funding this year than last year. Four colleges received funding for a total of 3.65 million dollars. Univeristy of Texas at Arlington received more money than Texas Fech. We gained on the University of Houston.

Haragan assured the Faculty Senate that research dollars brought to the university do not alone measure a faculty member's productivity. However, there is curnently no way to report to the Regents on unsponsored research.

## VIII. Announcements

President Whitsift congratulated Shelley Harp and Herschel Mann for being honored by Mortar Board as outstanding teachers.

The next Senate meeting will be on the first Wednesday, December 6, to avoid conflict with final examinations.

Whitsitt will atfend the Conference of Faculty Governance Organizations Novembef 29 through December l, so the Agenda Committee will meet Monday, November
