Women's Studies and Master's Degrees

The Women's Studies Program does not currently offer an MA degree, but:

- With the approval of major department and the Women's Studies Director, Women's Studies courses may be approved as coursework toward either the major field of the Masters Program or as a minor field (2-3 courses outside the major field, as approved by the Department Chair or Graduate Advisor in the major field/department).
- Faculty affiliated with the Women's Studies Program may serve on Master's thesis advisory committees, as appointed by the Dean of the Graduate School (p.75 07-08 catalog).

Women's Studies and Doctoral Degrees

The Women's Studies Program does not currently offer a PhD Program, but:

- 15 hours of Women's Studies graduate coursework can qualify as a minor field. If so, Women's Studies must be included in the qualifying examination and must be represented on the student's doctoral committee, as appointed by the Dean of the Graduate School.
- Individual Women's Studies graduate courses may be included in the coursework required for the major field, upon approval by the research advisor.

Women's Studies Graduate Certificate Program (GCP)

- Approved in 2006 by the TTU Graduate School, TTU Academic Council, and State of Texas Coordinating Board
- Can function as a stand-alone credential; Graduate School has separate admissions criteria for students enrolling for Graduate Certificate only (p.77, 07-08 catalog).
- Can function as additional credential earned within framework of doctoral program
- Only one non-TTU course can be applied toward Graduate Certificate requirements, and only with approval of *both* Dean of the Graduate School and Director of Women's Studies.
- To be awarded the Graduate Certificate, students must maintain a minimum 3.0 GPA across all courses required for completion of the Certificate.
- Requirements for the Graduate Certificate include these courses:
 - WS 5360 Foundations of Women's Thought
 - WS 5310 Feminist Thought and Theories
 - ‡WS 5320 Feminist Research Methodologies
- Requirements also include 9 hours of electives approved by the Director of Women's Studies. These electives may include but are not limited to:
 - ‡WS 5000 Practicum in Women's Studies
 - ‡WS 5300 Directed Studies
 - ‡WS 5340 Special Topics in Women's StudiesApproved courses from other departments.

‡ With approval by the Director of the Women's Studies Program, these courses may be taken for credit more than once.

Did You Know?

Individual Women's Studies graduate courses might also be approved by major departments toward the coursework requirements of other interdisciplinary graduate degree programs. These include Ethnic Studies, Comparative Literature, and Fine Arts. Consult your graduate advisor.

MA Interdisciplinary Studies with a Women's Studies Field

- Of 3 subject areas, one can be Women's Studies.
- 36 hour non-thesis option: maximum 12 hours in WS prefix or WS approved graduate courses; Students select exam or portfolio review
- thesis option (24 hours plus 6 hours of IS 6000)
 - faculty committee organized by Graduate School
 - can include Women's Studies affiliated faculty
