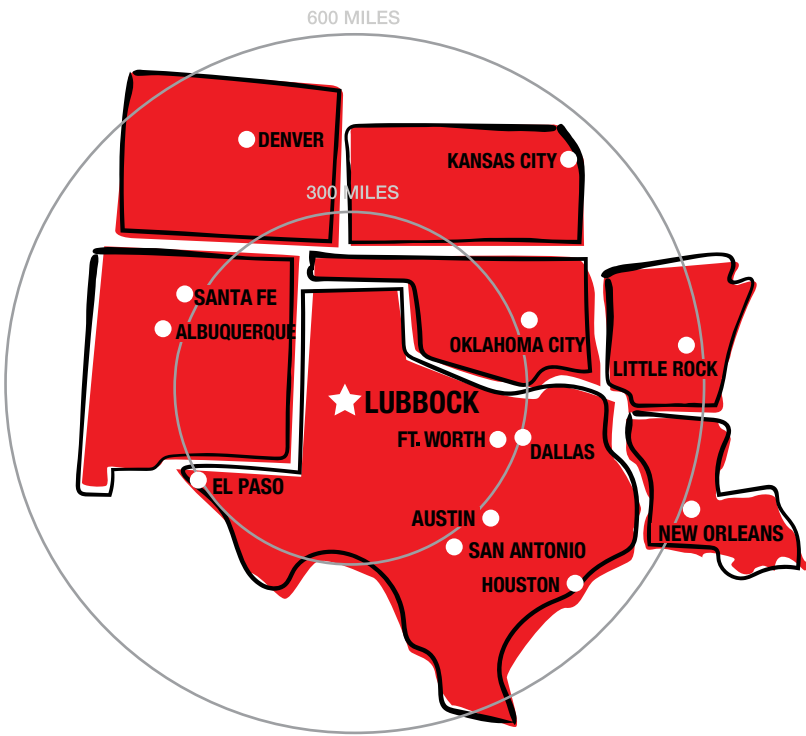

- Official SAT and/or ACT scores (Optional)

Assured Admission

Students graduating from high school may be assured admission by presenting the required combination of test scores and class rank indicated below.

High School Rank	ACT / SAT	
Top 10%	No Minimum	
First Quarter (11%-25%)	24	1180
Second Quarter	26	1240
Third Quarter	27	1280
Fourth Quarter	Application Review	

ACT composite score, SAT reflects evidence-based reading and writing, and math; the highest section scores from multiple tests on the ACT and SAT will be used to maximize score. Assured admission is granted to all students who hold competitive scholarships awarded by an official Texas Tech scholarship committee.

Students applying to the following majors should meet assured admission or be reviewed and accepted by the college or department:

Biological Sciences
Business (all)
Engineering (all)
Interior Design
Physics

Students who are accepted to Texas Tech but not accepted to these majors will be placed into an Exploratory Program.

Application Review

Students who do not submit ACT and/or SAT scores on their application or do not meet assured admission will be evaluated holistically.

- Academic course selection (Honors, AP, Pre-AP, Dual Credit, IB)
- Extracurricular activities
- Leadership experiences
- Civic or other service activities
- Socioeconomic background
- Family educational background
- Special talents or awards
- Unique experiences and background

We strongly encourage essays from the admissions application and up to three letters of recommendation.

Transfer application checklist

These items are required for transferring:

- Applications for admission are available at applytexas.org, or commonapp.org. Texas Tech has no preference for one type of application over another, but it's important that you submit only one per admissions cycle.
- \$75 application fee or fee waiver*
- Official transcripts from all colleges attended.
Students must submit a high school/secondary transcript if fewer than 12 transferable hours.

GPA is cumulative for all transferable courses from all schools attended. Courses taken for grade replacement are used for GPA calculation only if the same course is repeated at the institution where it was originally taken.

Some academic colleges and departments at Texas Tech University only accept students who meet assured admission criteria or meet specified GPA minimums.

Application Review

Transfer students who do not meet assured admission but have at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA are evaluated holistically based on the following:

- Academic course selection
- Extracurricular activities
- Leadership experiences
- Civic or other service activities
- Socioeconomic background
- Family educational background
- Special talents or awards
- Unique experiences and background
- ACT/SAT scores

We strongly encourage essays from the admissions application and up to three letters of recommendation.

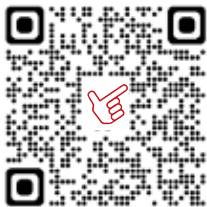

PRESIDENTIAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS
Merit scholarships are awarded to entering first-time freshmen and transfer students who show exceptional academic ability. Annual award amounts pay one-half toward fall and one-half toward spring terms. Transfer students may qualify if admitted by July 31st for fall entry or January 5th for spring entry.

NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS
You could qualify for Texas resident tuition and fees when awarded at least \$1,000 in competitive scholarships from Texas Tech per academic year.

TRANSFER YOUR FINANCIAL AID
You can ensure aid eligibility when you transfer from your current school by adding Texas Tech as a school you plan to attend on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). www.fafsa.ed.gov
