- 3. PROJECT GRAPHICS/PHOTOGRAPHY (12 SLIDES MAXIMUM): All information necessary, including photographs, to graphically illustrate the design concept/design solution. A graphic scale should be included on all applicable drawings.

- Submissions by an entrant ("Entrant") must be received no later than July 19, 2024 (23:59 hours US Central Daylight Time) and must be submitted online via this link: surveymonkey.com/r/MVQGYJ9.
- 2. A non-refundable payment of \$300 is required for each project submitted. Payments may be made at give.ttu.edu/dla. - The entrant MUST NOT self-identify (e.g. company or individual name, logo) on any of the submission PDFs.
