ENGLISH: The 12 hours of English must consist of ENGL 1301 and 1302 and two literature Courses (which excludes ENGL 2311, 3370, 3371, 3380, 4360, 4372, 4373, 4300). CLAS 1310 or ENGL 2311 may be used to fulfill the final 3 hours. (For B. S. only, a literature course will also satisfy the 3 hour Humanities requirement.)		
ORAL COMMUNICATION: COMS 2300, 3358; HDFS 2320; MGT 3373 (MGT 3373 may not be taken by correspondence); PETR 3308.	3	3
FOREIGN LANGUAGE: A student must complete 6 hours at the sophomore level or above in a single language. A student who enrolls in the first-year sequence will have an 11-16 hour requirement. A student who enrolls in the second-year sequence will have a 6 hour requirement. The following courses may not be used to fulfill the foreign language requirement: GERM 4302, 4312; RUSN 2303, 3301, 3302, 4301, 4311. <i>not a prs.</i>	6-16	6-16
MATHEMATICS & LOGICAL REASONING: MATH courses (except 0301, 0302, 3430); PHIL 2310 or 4310 may be used to satisfy 3 hours of this requirement; other courses listed in the Core Curriculum Requirements (e.g. MUTH 3303, PSY 3403(3400) and SOC 3391) may not be used. Courses cited as options for any other requirement are excluded.	6	6
NATURAL SCIENCE: If 4 or more high school semesters of natural laboratory science (not including general, physical, or applied science) are accepted for admission, the requirement is 8 hrs.; if not, the requirement is 11 hours. The first 8 hours of the requirement must come from Core Curriculum approved laboratory courses in the following areas: ANTH 2300 & 2100; ASTR 1300 & 1100, 1301 & 1101; ATMO 1300 & 1100; BIOL 1313 & 1113, 1401, 1402, 1403, 1404; CHEM 1305 & 1105, 1306 & 1106, 1307 & 1107, 1308 & 1108; GEOG 1401, 1402; GEOL 1303 & 1101, 1304 & 1102, 1350 & 1105; HONS 2305 & 2115, 2306 & 2116; PHYS 1303 & 1101, 1306 & 1103, 1307 & 1104, 1308 & 1105, 1406, 2301 & 1106; PSS 1411, 2330 & 2130, 2401, 3402; ZOOL 2403. Also accepted for fulfilling this requirement are AERS 1105, 1106; DAN 1107, 1304, 2100, 2102 (non-majors need instructor's permission); MILS 1101, 1102; MUEN 1103 (marching band). In addition to the above General Degree requirements, students must take major, minor, and elective courses sufficient to total a minimum of 125 hours for a B. A. degree (132 hours for MCOM) and a minimum of 126 hours for a B. S. degree.

A minimum of 40 semester hours of courses at the 3000-4000 level must be taken from the major, minor, electives, and/or General Degree Requirements.

Not more than 24 hours in agriculture, architecture, business administration, education, engineering, and/or human sciences may be counted toward a degree, and not more than 6 hours additional if the minor is taken outside Arts and Sciences.

For other Arts and Sciences degrees, please refer to General Degree Requirements for your degree in the 1999-2000 Undergraduate Catalog (pgs. 160 – 167).
