## **Biography**

Dr. Conway has served in the Bricker Endowed Chair in Wildlife Management since August, 2014, and he and his students' research focuses upon a wide variety of ecologically relevant and applied wildlife population, conservation, and management issues, including both game and nongame species. Most of our work has common themes of wildlife-habitat relationships, population and community dynamics, population management, restoration, and conservation, and more recent efforts have focused upon wildlife disease and toxicology.
