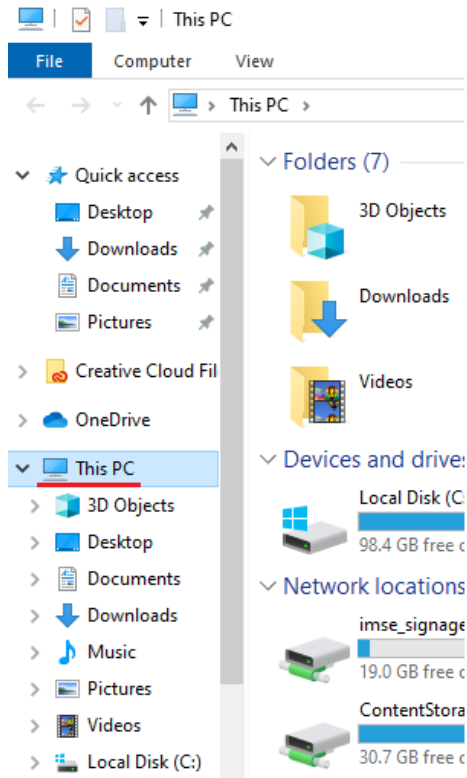
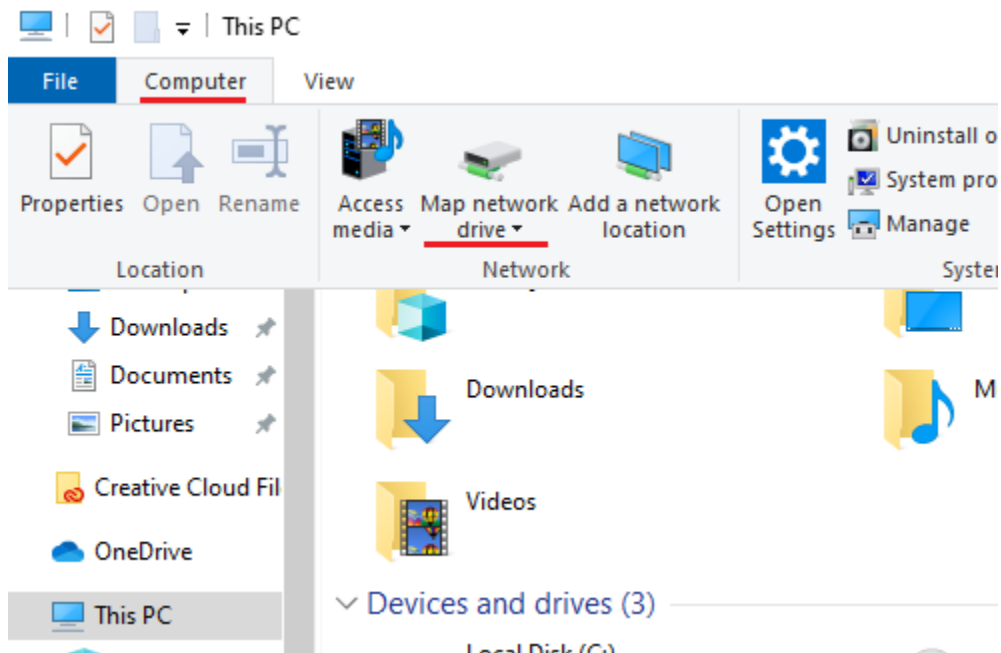


How to map a network drive in Windows 10


1. In File Explorer, click **This PC**



2. Click **Computer** and then click **Map network drive**



3. In the Map Network Drive window, select any drive letter from the “Drive” dropdown list. You can also leave the default drive letter selected by the system.

4. In the “Folder” field, type the network share path to the network drive.

5. Make sure that the “Reconnect at sign-in” check box is selected and click **Finish**.

Outcome: The network drive has been mapped. If you left the “Reconnect at sign-in” checkbox selected, the network drive will remain mapped persistently, until you manually disconnect from it.
