This graduate certificate develops K-12 STEM teacher researchers in ONE YEAR using 5-week (summer), 8-week (advanced), and 15 week (traditional) courses that focus on the structures and policies that dictate K-12 STEM education and how to lead in fostering change to systemically improve K-12 STEM education.

Graduates of this certificate will develop, implement, evaluate, and research the efficacy of the implemented interventions to impact STEM education scholarship.
