
Toward a System of Great Schools: A Framework for District Innovation

- To answer this question, I worked with colleagues and district practitioners to develop a framework for **district level**, **context-specific problem solving**.
- Ideas that influenced this framework:
 - Targeted Universalism: Set universal goals and targeted means/processes
 - Ambidextrous Organization Theory: Be a learning organization by balancing innovation with maintenance of successful strategies
 - System of Great Schools District Case Studies: Districts are using elements of this framework across Texas, including San Antonio, Aldine, Victoria, and Lubbock
 - Improvement Science: Build regular cycles of data-driven decision making
 - Human Centered Design: Focus on what "end users" families want and need
