

# Addressing the High Cost of Higher Education: A Look at the Financial Burden of Pre-Enrollment Fees

### **Current Challenges for Students:**

- Applying to multiple universities can be costly, and most universities will not process an application until the fee is paid.
- Transfer and graduate students incur transcript fees to send transcripts to employers or other IHEs. Colleges and universities will not release transcripts if students have an outstanding balance.
- Orientation fees are mandatory, non-refundable, and must be paid prior to attending.

#### Updated Policies for Texas A&M University San Antonio:

- Beginning Fall 2020, application fee payment status will not impact application processing.
- Conditional Admissions with unofficial transcripts.
- Partnership with National Student Clearinghouse. \*In Progress
- Beginning Fall 2022, orientation fees will be automatically included in tuition bill.
