






■ (Co-Design)

In 2015, Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) includes serious protections for vulnerable students which have inevitably transpired unequal and protections of civil liberties in accordance with the Equal Protection Clause as part of the first section of the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution was primarily mandated to guarantee that all citizens would have the guaranteed right to equal protection by law.

No State shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any State deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws






(Implement)

Propagating Necessary Awareness Towards Hierarchical Resolve The only parents notified during "room clear" misbehavior modification procedures are those of the student committing the act.

- nullify forms of (mis)behavioral accommodations/modifications (such as room clear, or planned ignorance while sharp objects fly across the room) that impede the learning process for all by removing the playing field out from under residing bodies.
- Of most importance, behavior interventions facilitated within Behavioral Intervention Plans (BIP) should focus on accommodating behaviors not misbehaviors that rob education of equal protection liberties guaranteed within the 14th amendment in which are considered punishable by law.

- (study) In accordance with criminal justice law code manual, 1610. Assault -- 18 U.S.C. 351(e) divides assault into two categories: those that result in personal injury, which are punishable by 10 years of imprisonment and a fine; and all others, which are punishable by one year of imprisonment and a fine.
- Yet, 504 protections foster escalations of assault daily, which is the opposite of leastrestrictive.
- This is not *leveling the playing field*; this is removing the playing field by accommodating/modifying the misbehavior of the few.

Equality



The assumption is that everyone benefits from the same supports. This is equal treatment.

Equity



Everyone gets the supports they need (this is the concept of "affirmative action"), thus producing equity.

Justice



All 3 can see the game without supports or accommodations because the cause(s) of the inequity was addressed. The systemic barrier has been removed.

Injustice





Students, staff, and innocent bystanders are stripped of 14th amendment rights without equal civil protections – subjected to, but not limited to, what is considered against the law of related offenses containing criminal threats and intimidation <u>Legal Implications of Criminal Threats and Intimidation</u>:

- **Assault:** Assault is when someone causes another person to fear that they will be physically harmed. Physical contact is not necessary to prove assault; a threat is enough to prove assault.
- Menacing: Menacing is a crime with which people are charged when they intentionally cause someone to fear for their physical safety.
- Harassment: <u>Harassment is conduct</u> involving any communications (phone call, email, voicemail, text messages, etc.), in-person stalking, or any other persistent and repeated actions meant to intimidate someone over an extended period.
- **Criminal mischief:** This means damaging property while making threats or engaging in intimidation.





KEY FINDINGS

The severity of teacher victimization

- For each of the seven different types of victimization, victimized teachers were asked to rate the seriousness of their most recent victimization by students.
- As expected, physical assault victimization was rated as the most serious event of victimization, compared to other types of victimization by students. The findings in Figure 1 show that 48 percent of physical assault victims rated their victimization as serious or very serious, while 17 percent of victims of theft/vandalism reported their victimization as serious or very serious.
- Approximately one-fourth of victimized teachers on sexual harassment, verbal abuse, and non-physical contact aggression rated their most recent victimization as serious or very serious respectively.
- Interestingly, approximately one-third of victims of cyberbullying (36%) and traditional bullying (31%) by students reported that their victimization was serious or very serious incidents, higher than all other types of victimization (with the exception of physical assault victimization).
