



EDUCATION FUNDING BY SOURCE, 2019–2020 SCHOOL YEAR

Actions Taken During the Policy Project Process:

- Initial Research and Data Collection: Conducted research on historical and current funding mechanisms, including property tax reliance and the recapture system.

- **Public Awareness Campaigns:** Launch targeted campaigns to raise public awareness about funding disparities and their impact on student outcomes, fostering broader support for policy changes.
