

# AWARDS 2024

The Office of Fraternity & Sorority Life is pleased to announce the 2024 FSL Awards. The FSL Awards are a time to celebrate all the achievements that Chapters have had over the past calendar year. Chapters are encouraged to use the standards listed under each category as a *best practice* guide to aid in their planning, goal setting, and general chapter operations. Fraternity & Sorority Life will recognize those chapters that demonstrate excellence in meeting these standards.

# **Guidelines:**

Each category submission will be scored by external FSL Professionals across the country. Every category will contain an application that requires you to upload documentation or a written response that corresponds with the application criteria statements. Each category is worth a total of ten (10) points. The submission will be evaluated using a rubric with a scale of 1 - 10. Below are the possible scores and meaning:

- Below 5 Points = Below Expectations
- 5-6 Points = Achieved Expectations
- 7-8 Points = Excellent
- 9-10 Points = Outstanding

Applications must be submitted via the submission forms:

• The forms will be available on November 1st, 2024.

# All submissions are due no later than 11:59pm CST on Sunday, February 2nd, 2025. Late submissions are not accepted nor will be evaluated.

The Chapter with the highest overall score for each category will be the winner. Each council that has applicants can win each award. Any Chapters who receive an "Excellent" or "Outstanding" score for each award will also be recognized.

To be eligible for Chapter Awards, the Chapter must be in good standing with their Inter/National Organization, Council, and the University.

The evaluation period for recognition will be the **2024 Calendar Year** which means any activity, program, etc. which occurred from January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024, through December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024, will be accepted and considered towards the FSL Awards.

The Office of Fraternity & Sorority Life will host the annual FSL Awards Ceremony on **March 31st, 2025**, at 6pm CST. In the weeks following the FSL Awards Ceremony, all Chapters who applied for FSL Awards will receive their official scores and any feedback provided by the external judges.

We are thankful for your participation in the FSL Awards process, and we hope these standards will serve as a helpful guide to point your Chapter towards excellence!

# **Chapter Awards Overview**

#### Academic Achievement Program of the Year

- The submission must be 500 words or less and documentation is required.

# **Developmental Program of the Year**

- Highlight a leadership or member development program, event, or initiative the Chapter hosted for Members, FSL, or the Texas Tech Community.
- The following areas are examples of events that could be covered in developmental programs:
  - Leadership Development
  - Member Development
  - Individual Development
  - Group Development
- Describe how this program positively impacted the intended audience and enabled effective and measurable change.
- Events, programs, and initiatives can be a one-time occurrence or a series and could be hosted in any manner (virtual, hybrid, or in-person).
- The submission must be 500 words or less and documentation is required.

# Philanthropy & Civic Engagement Program of the Year

- Highlight a philanthropic or service program, event, or initiative the Chapter hosted for Members, FSL, or the Texas Tech Community.
- Describe how this program or event positively impacted the intended audience and enabled effective and measurable service.
- Events, programs, and initiatives can be a one-time occurrence or a series and could be hosted in any manner (virtual, hybrid, or in-person).
- The submission must be 500 words or less and documentation is required.

# **Community Collaboration Program of the Year**

- Highlight a community and belonging program, event, or initiative the Chapter hosted for Members, FSL, or the Texas Tech Community.
- The following areas are examples of events that could be covered in community collaboration:
  - Collaborations with other chapters
  - Collaborations with student organizations
  - Collaborations with Lubbock Community organizations
- Describe how this program or event positively impacted the intended audience and enabled effective and measurable service.
- Events, programs, and initiatives can be a one-time occurrence or a series and could be hosted in any manner (virtual, hybrid, or in-person).
- The submission must be 500 words or less and documentation is required.

# **Brotherhood/Sisterhood Program of the Year**

- Highlight a brotherhood or sisterhood program, event, or initiative the Chapter hosted for Members, FSL, or the Texas Tech Community.
- Describe how this program or event positively impacted the intended audience and enabled effective and measurable service.
- Events, programs, and initiatives can be a one-time occurrence or a series and could be hosted in any manner (virtual, hybrid, or in-person).
- The submission must be 500 words or less and documentation is required.

#### Wellness Program of the Year

- Highlight a wellness program, event, or initiative the Chapter hosted for Members, FSL, or the Texas Tech Community.
- The following areas are examples of events that could be covered in wellness:
  - Mental Health Support
  - Physical Health Support
  - Nutrition Workshops
  - Financial Wellness Workshops
  - Holistic Wellness Programs
- Describe how this program or event positively impacted the intended audience and enabled effective and measurable engagement.
- Events, programs, and initiatives can be a one-time occurrence or a series and could be hosted in any manner (virtual, hybrid, or in-person).
- The submission must be 500 words or less and documentation is required.

# **Community Builder Award**

This award is given to an individual who displays a solid commitment to promoting unity and inclusion within their Chapter, Council, and the FSL Community at Texas Tech University.

  - Must be an active member of a recognized council at Texas Tech University (IFC, CPH, MGC, or NPHC)
  - Has been a member of their fraternity/sorority for at least one (1) semester
  - Application

# **Emerging Leader Award**

This individual has displayed a strong sense of values and leadership through their actions and has made a positive impact during their time in the community.

- Criteria
  - o 2.75 Cumulative GPA
  - Must be within first  $(1^{st})$  year of membership
  - Must be in good standing with their organization
- Application
  - o Name
  - Chapter

#### **Helping Hand Award**

This award is given to a campus or community partner (person, department, or organization) that has demonstrated a strong commitment to helping an organization or the FSL Community at Texas Tech University progress.

- Criteria
  - May be a faculty/staff member on campus, a campus department, Lubbock or university organization, or a Lubbock community member
  - Cannot be a current Chapter Advisor
  - Cannot be a current undergraduate member in the FSL Community
- Application
