

Arts & Humanities Conference In-Person Competitor Guide

Overview:

The 2024 Arts & Humanities Conference is in person. Students competing will have <u>5 minutes</u> to present their work or research the day of the competition.

In-Person Submission Rules:

- Abstracts and presentation slides due Friday, November 1st by 5:00 p.m.
- Slides need to be emailed to studentlife.gradschool@ttu.edu. Slides submitted after 5:00 p.m. on Friday,

 November 1st, will not be accepted. We highly encourage all participants to submit their slides before the deadline to allow our team to test your presentation for errors or issues.
- Please create your presentation in PowerPoint. If your file is too large to send in an email, please send us a link to download it on OneDrive. Presentations sent as a PDF may cause blurry slides, skewed text, and loss of images.
- PowerPoint presentations should be in a 16:9 (widescreen) format.
- The day of the competition, you will check in and be directed to your presentation room. A moderator will be in the room to ensure you do not exceed the 5-minute time limit during your presentation. Presentations that exceed the 5-minute time limit will be disqualified.
- An introduction slide will be displayed before your presentation begins and will include your name, academic information, and the title of your presentation. The Graduate Student Life team will create this, and you do not need to create this in your presentation.
- After the introduction slide, you can begin your presentation.
- The decision of the panel is final. Judging will focus on the presentation and the student's ability to communicate research to a non-specialist audience.

FAQ:

• Will participating in this competition count as an excused absence?

Yes. All Graduate School research competitions are university-sanctioned activities and, therefore, constitute an excused absence. If you need an excuse note, please email studentlife.gradschool@ttu.edu to request one.

- I made an error on my slides; can I update it before the competition?
 - All competitors are required to submit their slides by Friday, November 1st. However, if you made an error on your submitted slides, please email us at studentlife.gradschool@ttu.edu as soon as possible.
- What should I wear for the competition?
 - We highly recommend professional business attire.
- I don't have professional business attire. What should I do?
 - We recommend visiting the University Career Center for information on their career closet. They have a variety of business professional attire for all individuals.
- I can't stay the entire time. What should I do?
 - Please notify Graduate Student Life at studentlife.gradschool@ttu.edu as soon as possible.

There will be a first, second, and third-place winner in each competition category.

We will begin sending scanned copies the week of November 18th.
