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#### **ADMISSION TO HONORS COURSES**

Honors courses are designed for Honors College members; however, any TTU student with a GPA of 3.0 or better is eligible to enroll in an Honors section as space permits.

#### **GRADUATION WITH HONORS DESIGNATIONS**

Honors students must complete a minimum of 24 hours in Honors coursework to graduate from Texas Tech University with the transcript designation "with Honors from the Honors College." Please note that a grade of B- or above must be earned in an Honors course (or HE+ course) in order for Honors credit to be applied.

A student who wishes to graduate with the transcript designation "with Highest Honors from the Honors College" must complete an Honors thesis and an additional 6 hours of thesis-specific coursework. Permission from the Honors College is required before beginning the Honors thesis.

Students must maintain a TTU GPA of 3.5 to remain in the Honors College and graduate with either of the above Honors designations.

Students intending to graduate with either designation must file an "Intent to Graduate" form with the Honors College one year prior to the graduation date. Honors College designations are listed on the transcript and the diploma. These are in addition to other distinctions graduates may earn, such as Latin Honors (e.g., Summa cum laude, Magna cum laude, and Cum laude).

Spain is our classroom in this Honors summit experience course: a two-week backpacking trip on the Camino de Santiago, the famed thousand year-old pilgrimage route to the picturesque city of Santiago de Compostela. We'll focus our work on developing leadership skills and understanding group dynamics, as well as exploring the natural and cultural history of northern Spain and the Camino. Students will take on leadership roles, and be offered peer feedback on judgment and decision-making. Creative and critical writing and reading will complete our training. We'll conduct writing workshops in the field. In addition, we'll attend to experiences in solitude and in community, and make a point of exploring the flora, fauna, geology, weathers, archaeology, history, and culture of the region.

The television series The Walking Dead became a runaway hit with audiences and the film World War Z was a highly successful blockbuster. Films like Warm Bodies were sleeper hits appealing to today's youth culture. Zombie films, literature, video games, comics, action figures, and artistic works have permeated our culture to such extents that one might say zombies are now considered mainstream. Like Frankenstein's monster and the vampire, the zombie is firmly placed within modern popular culture. Zombies have become a metaphor for our post-9/11 anxiety in a world filled with chaos. The zombie is the ultimate nightmare preying on our fears in a society where the concept of safety is often illusionary. The scholarly study of zombies has exploded in the last decade. This course will examine the zombie in all its various forms with a focus on film, literature, and sequential art. We will also look at the zombies' historical role in Haitian history and religion and throughout the world. We will discuss how zombies have evolved over time in film, literature, and sequential art as an icon of popular culture. This course will try to answer the question of why zombies continue to be popular and how the artistic renderings in film, sequential art, and literature changed over time. Can the zombie teach us anything about the world we live in and our social responsibilities within it? As a class, we will try to define what constitutes a zombie? This course is reading intensive and contains mature content.
