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ADMISSION TO HONORS COURSES

Honors courses are designed for Honors College members; however, any TTU student with a GPA of 3.0 or better is eligible to enroll in an Honors section as space permits.

GRADUATION WITH HONORS DESIGNATIONS

Honors students must complete a minimum of 24 hours in Honors coursework to graduate from Texas Tech University with the transcript designation “with Honors from the Honors College.” Please note that a grade of B- or above must be earned in an Honors course (or HE+ course) in order for Honors credit to be applied.

A student who wishes to graduate with the transcript designation “with Highest Honors from the Honors College” must complete an Honors thesis and an additional 6 hours of thesis-specific coursework. Permission from the Honors College is required before beginning the Honors thesis.

Students must maintain a TTU GPA of 3.5 to remain in the Honors College and graduate with either of the above Honors designations.

Students intending to graduate with either designation must file an “Intent to Graduate” form with the Honors College one year prior to the graduation date. Honors College designations are listed on the transcript and the diploma. These are in addition to other distinctions graduates may earn, such as Latin Honors (e.g., *Summa cum laude*, *Magna cum laude*, and *Cum laude*).

HONS 4302: Marvel Universe: Our Modern Mythology

Since 2008, the Marvel Cinematic Universe (MCU) has redefined the modern blockbuster, setting the standard for interconnected storytelling across film, television, and streaming platforms. With over \$4 billion in domestic box office revenue and Avengers: Endgame ranking among the highest-grossing films of all time, Marvel Studios has cemented its place in popular culture. But Marvel's story began long before Disney acquired the company in 2009. Originating as Timely Comics in the 1930s, Marvel evolved into a creative powerhouse in the 1960s under visionaries like Stan Lee, Jack Kirby, and Steve Ditko. Together, they built a universe of characters that continues to shape our cultural imagination. This HONS Summit course explores the rich history of Marvel Comics, the creators who defined its legacy, and the evolution of its cinematic and television presence. We will examine key stories, analyze the development of Marvel's shared universe, and discuss why its 8,000+ characters have become modern-day myths. Students will: Study some landmark Marvel stories and their cultural impact as well as lesser-known stories and characters; Explore Marvel's transition from page to screen; Create an original short film featuring Marvel characters as a final project; And as part of the course experience, we will attend a class screening of *Spider-Man: Brand New Day*. Please note this is a reading-intensive course and includes mature content.
