


### A Dedication to Dr. Charles Klein

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

## Agape Christian Preschool's Outdoor Learning Environment

In partnership with the Harris County chapter, members of the OLE! Texas Designer Network, Katie Summers and Meade Mitchell of TBG, created a design for the outdoor learning environment at Agape Christian Preschool in Pasadena, Texas. The center's mission is to meet the needs of the families of their community by providing a safe, healthy, and happy learning environment. Their philosophy emphasizes individual development and a well-rounded program to develop the whole child – physically, emotionally, socially, cognitively, and spiritually.



The center's outdoor space is divided into two outdoor learning environments; one which serves toddlers to children 5-years-old and the other area which serves children 5 – 12-years-old. Summers and Mitchell included the 12 Best Practice Indicators established by the Natural Learning Initiative. #### Course Description


The course is offered as a requirement for inclusion in the OLE! Texas Designer Network. It will cover the theoretical foundations, principles, and process for improving a childcare center Outdoor Learning Environment (OLE) as an evidence-based, design intervention as an early intervention strategy for combating obesity. It is delivered as a multi-day seminar and includes two parts, the background and foundations of the concepts followed by their practical application in a real or simulated design workshop. The seminar is facilitated by faculty of the Texas Tech University Coalition for Natural Learning and sponsored by the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) OLE! Texas initiative. Participants who complete all parts of the seminar, including the course evaluation, will be eligible for up to twelve (12) hours of Continuing Education Professional Hours.





## Designer Network Database Connects Childcare Centers with Designers

In partnership with the Texas Department of State Health Services, the OLE! Texas Design Team at Texas Tech University facilitates the <a href="Designer Network">Designer Network</a>. The purpose of the network is to connect childcare centers with designers trained in the OLE! Texas philosophy. When someone visits the Designer Network Database and clicks on a designer's name, a window of detailed information pops up which gives further information about how to contact the designer and which services they provide (example given below). To qualify for the Designer Network, designers must complete the educational and workshop practicum components of the designer training.
