In partnership with the Harris County chapter, members of the OLE! Texas Designer Network, Brandon Gauthier from PBK and Becky Luman from Healthy Tweaks LLC, created a design for the outdoor learning environment at Stream of Life Christian Academy (S.O.L.C.A) in Baytown, Texas. The center's mission as a Christian center is to help families raise their children into leaders with Christian principles and high academic standards. Their curriculum focuses on teaching children basic pre-school academics as well as basic knowledge and principles.



The center's outdoor space incorporates all 12 Best Practice Indicators and includes over a dozen play and learning settings. Some of the future features include a looping curvy pathway which connects the existing and new outdoor activities, gardens, mud and sand play, balance logs, a playhouse, outdoor classroom space and storage, new vegetation, as well as areas for acoustic and art play. These features will be implemented over various stages in the development of their outdoor learning environment.


New Resources Available for OLE! Texas Designers

We are excited to announce that we have new resources available for our members, which include the Workshop Kit and the Play Settings Notebook. These new resources guide our members through the OLE! Texas design process and provide inspiration for childcare centers.

The Workshop Kit has been created as an addition to the Designer Guide to serve as a check-list to guide the Trained OLE Designers through the preparation, activities, needed supplies, and responsibilities involved before, during, and after a workshop with a childcare center. With this resource, designers will have a better idea of what to expect, how to prepare, what to provide, and how to proceed after a workshop has been completed to develop their outdoor learning environment.

The Play Settings Notebook is a great tool for designers and workshop participants to look through to not only gain inspiration for types of play settings that can be incorporated into





the outdoor learning environment, but to also give a better understanding of how each Best Practice Indicator can be integrated into the outdoor learning environment. A variety of examples are provided in the notebook to display how each Best Practice Indicator can be integrated, regardless of a small or large budget.
