

The Lancaster Center is located southwest of downtown Fort Worth and serves the surrounding low-income community.

The Lancaster Center provides support to working parents and offers year-round care for developing children. The Lancaster project is unique due to its small size and urban location. The new Outdoor Learning Environment for the Lancaster location will be equipped to serve a variety of age groups including infant, toddler, and Pre-K youths.
