#### **CHARGE**

The Online Learning Committee promotes best practices in the online learning community and serves as a liaison between eLearning and COHS faculty and administrators.

#### **RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Serve as an information conduit among faculty, the College, and TTU Online.
- 2. Coordinate with the college representative on the university Online Learning Council regarding issues, new courses, new academic programs, new initiatives.
- 3. Seek best practices regarding online pedagogy and work with faculty members to convey these best practices.
- 4. Serve as a resource for those developing new courses or revising existing ones.
- 5. Be available to review/assess new and existing courses as appropriate.

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

- One faculty member from each academic unit in the college, names are provided by the department chairs.
- The Director of Academic Advising and Retention and the Director of Marketing and External Relations serve as *ex-officio* members of the committee.
- The committee chair is chosen from among the committee members.
- The Associate Dean for Academics and Faculty serves as an *ad hoc* member and facilitates its work.



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#### **OPERATING PROCEDURES**

- Attend meetings as called by the Associate Dean for Academics and Faculty.
- Provide advice and assistance to representative units regarding best practices and resources for effective online teaching.
- Develop, review, implement, and assess policies regarding online learning in the CHHS.
