



Graduation Rates for Full-Time, Degree-Seeking First-Year Students, Fall 2011 - Fall 2015 Cohorts








Fall 2019 First-Year Student by Gender











Fall 2019 Total Enrollment by Gender*









Undergraduate Students Served by the Honors College

Fall 2019 Total Enrollment by Geographic Origin






The seal of Texas Tech was designed in 1924 by William Ward Watkin. The 4 main symbols on the seal are the book for "church", star for "state", key for "home", and lamp for "school". Between these 4 symbols are cotton bolls representing the areas strong cotton industry. Finally, above these sits an eagle suggestive of our country.

The statue of Will Rogers and his horse, Soapsuds, was a dedication by his friend Amon G. Carter in 1950. This statue was placed on campus with Will riding into the western sunset. However, this caused his backside to be facing the entrance of the University so the horse and Will were turned 23 degrees to have his posterior facing the direction of Texas A&M. Before every home game, Will and his horse are wrapped in red crepe paper by the Saddle Tramps.





The Dairy Barn is one of the first four original buildings on campus and served as a teaching facility for 40 years. Until 1935, students were allowed to bring their own cows to campus and market their own milk products through the Student Dairy Association. The Dairy Manufacturers Department sold the milk and ice cream produced to the college campus and local Lubbock residents.



The Administration Building was one of the first four buildings on campus modeled after the Universidad de Alcala de Henares in Alcalá de Henares, Spain. The Administration building consists of three floors and a basement and includes twin bell towers, double wings, and a courtyard. It also houses the offices of the President and the Provost, as well as Institutional Research.



On September 19th, 2019, Texas Tech broke ground on Texas' first new veterinary school in more than 100 years. Responding to the needs of our state and nation. the university has developed an innovative, world-class School of Veterinary Medicine to address the critical shortage of veterinarians serving small, rural and agricultural communities throughout Texas and to increase the access to affordable veterinary education in Texas.

Raider Red is one of the mascots of Texas Tech University. The Southwest Conference created a rule in 1971 forbidding the bringing of live animal mascots to away games unless permitted by the host school. Because the Masked Rider had the potential to be prohibited, Raider Red was created as an alternative. A member of the Saddle Tramps, Jim Gaspard, created the original design of the Raider Red costume based on a character created by the cartoonist and former mayor of Lubbock. Dirk West.
