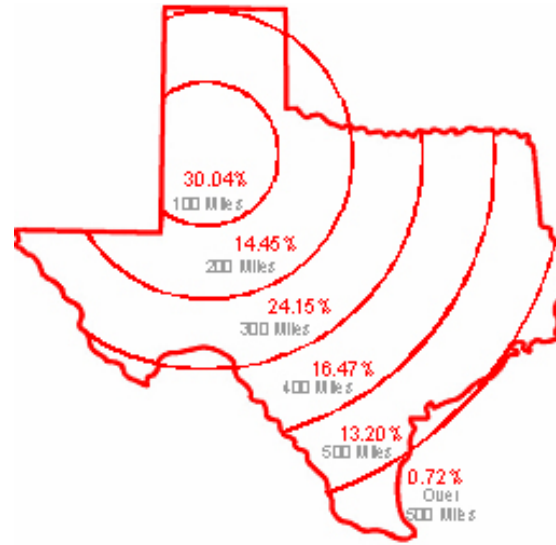


**Distribution of Total Enrollment from Texas by 100-mile Increments**

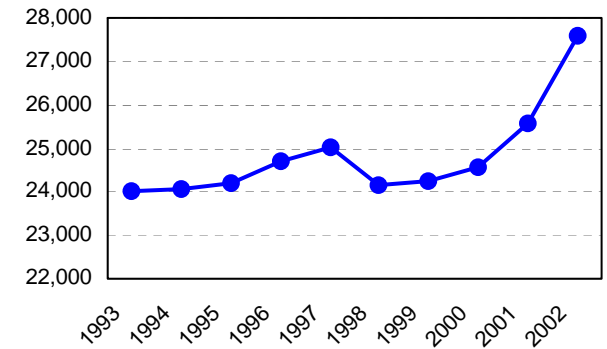

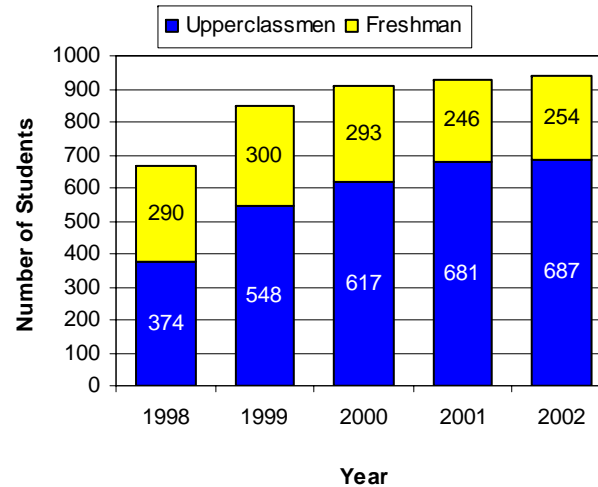
**Did you know?**

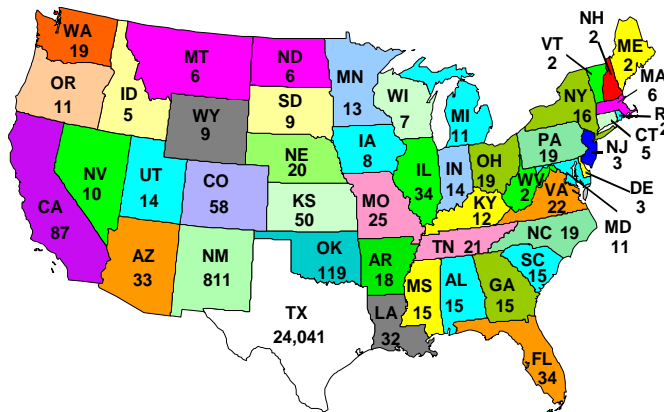

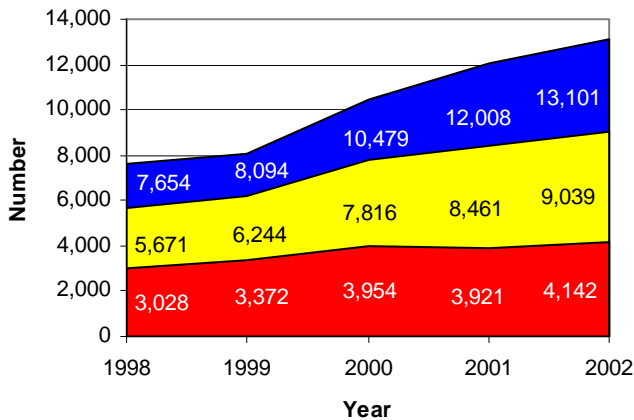

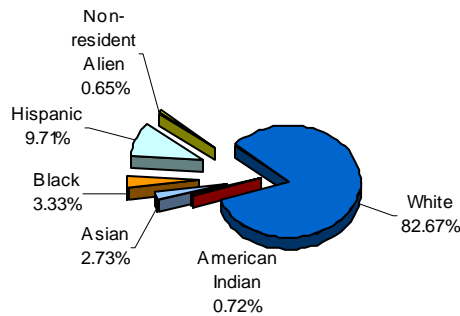

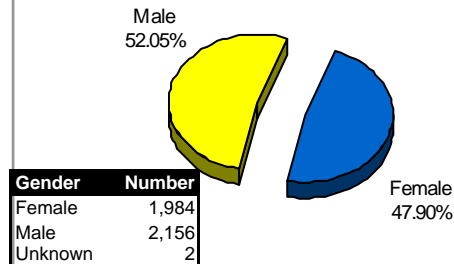

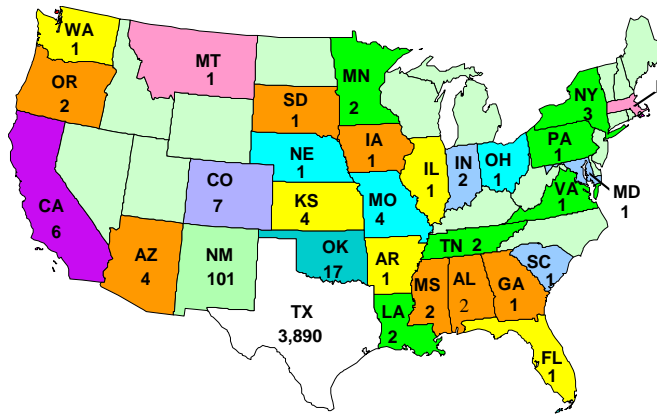
### New Enrolled Freshmen by Ethnicity



### New Enrolled Freshmen by Gender



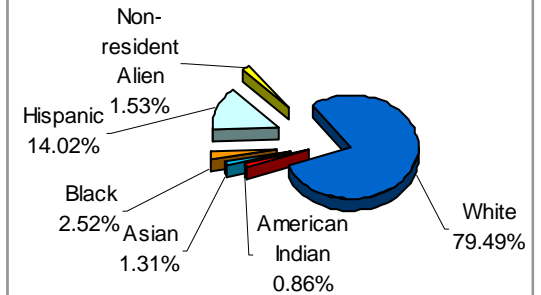
## New Freshmen Distribution by State



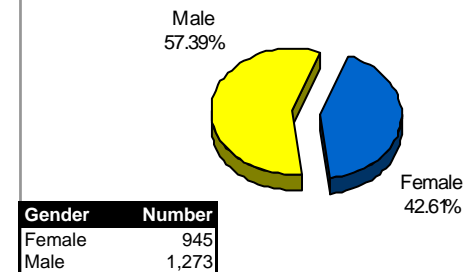

### New Transfer Students by Ethnicity



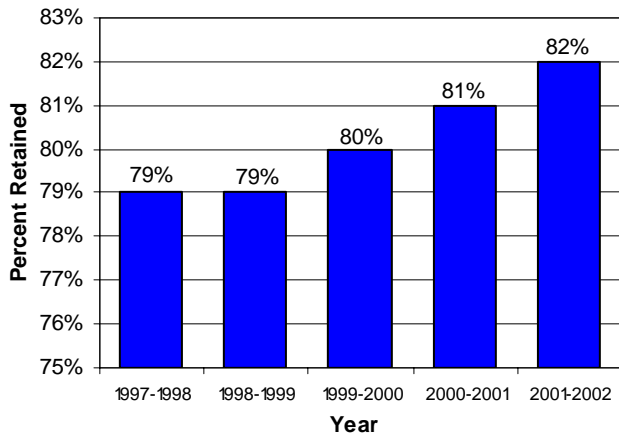
### New Transfer Students by Gender

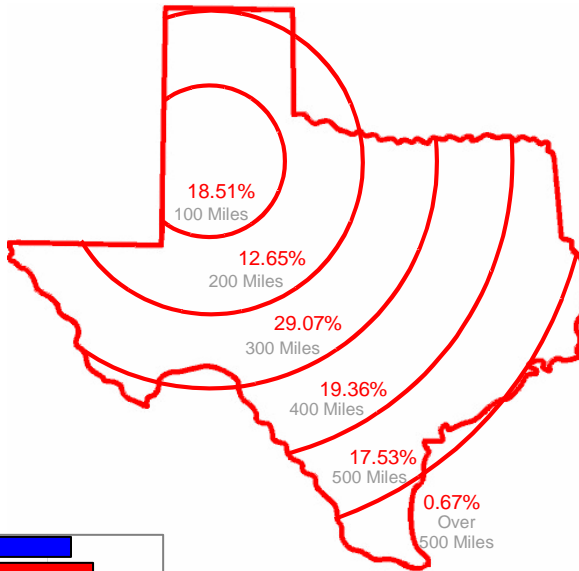
### One Year Retention Rate of New Full-Time Freshmen\* FY 1997 - 1998 to FY 2001 - 2002

### Distribution of New Freshmen from Texas by 100-Mile Increments

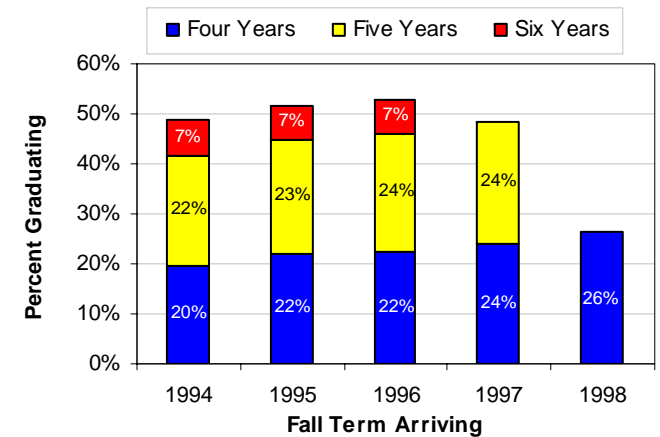

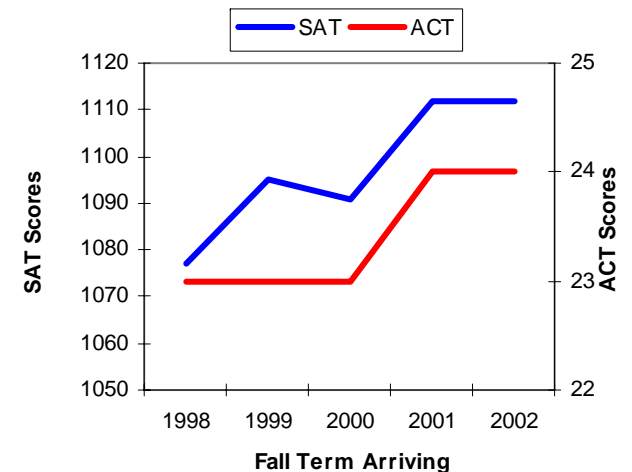
