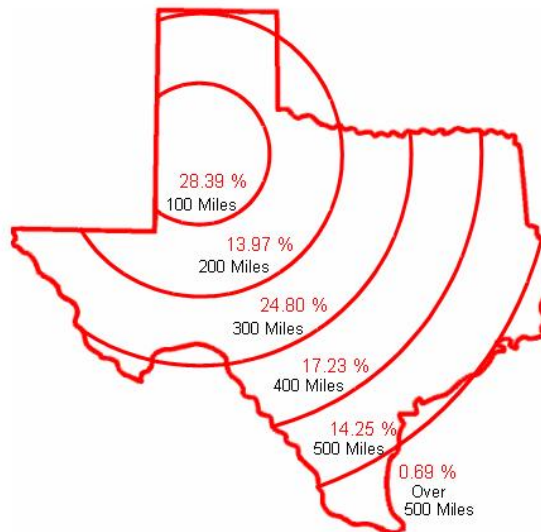

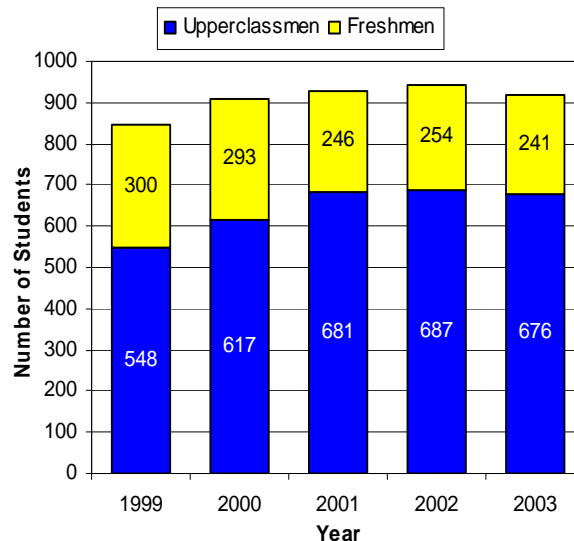
Distribution of Total Enrollment from Texas by 100-mile Increments

Distribution of Total Enrollment from Texas



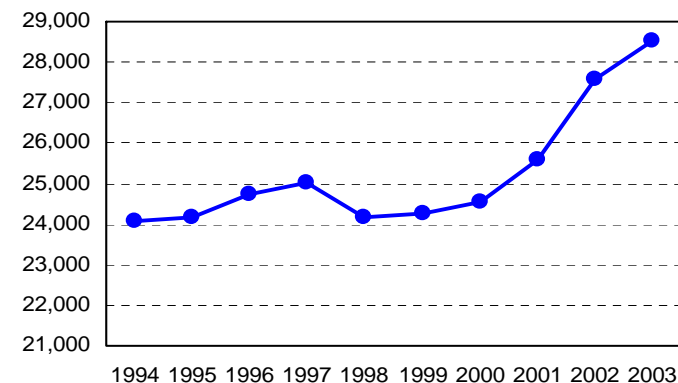

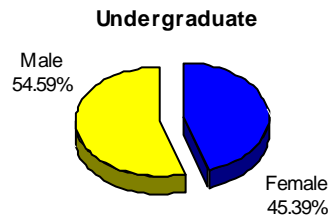

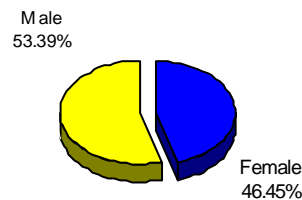

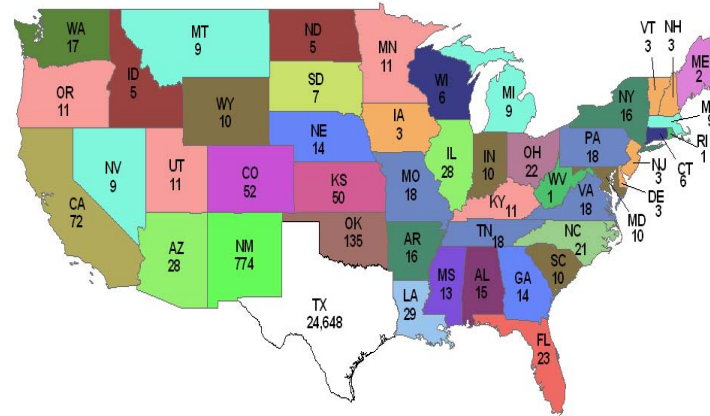
Total Enrollment by Gender

Student Distribution by State



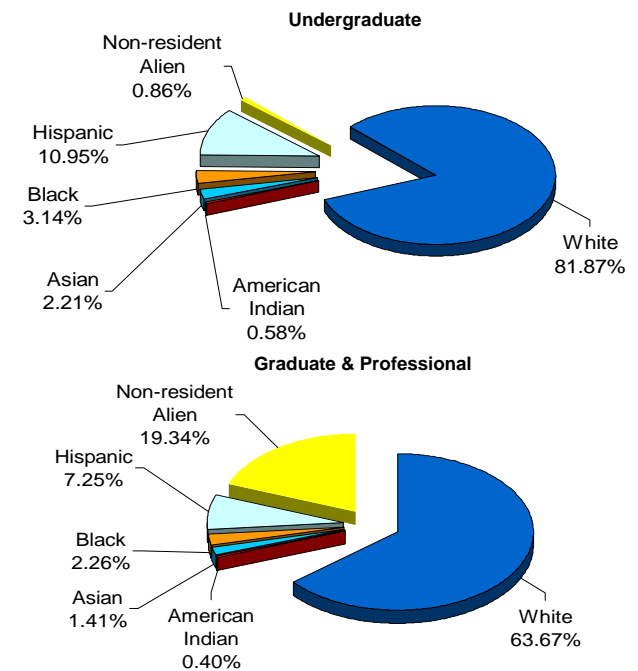

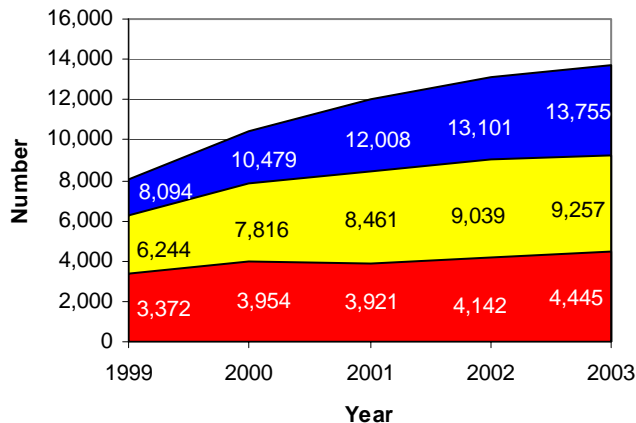

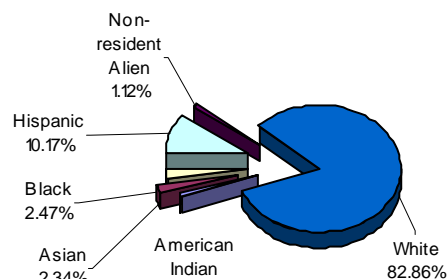

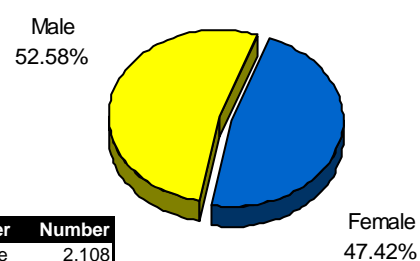

New Enrolled Freshmen by Gender

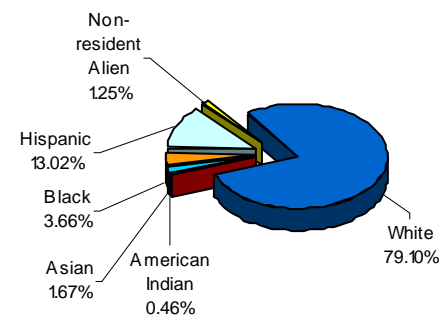

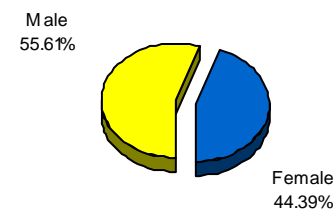

New Transfer Students by Gender



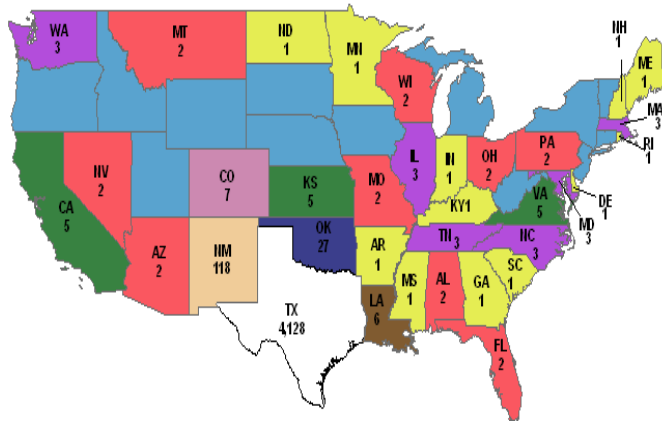

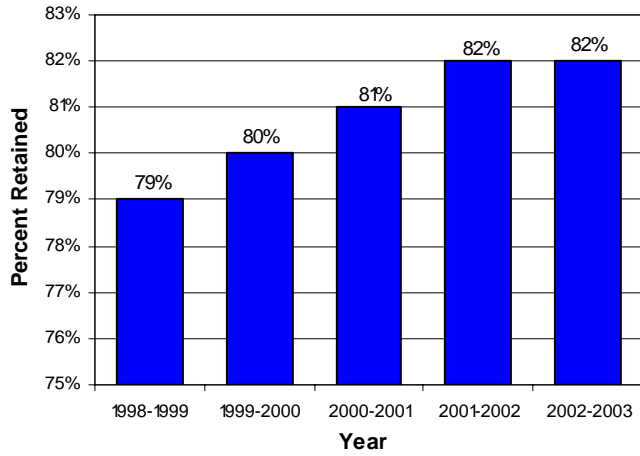
New Freshmen Distribution by State

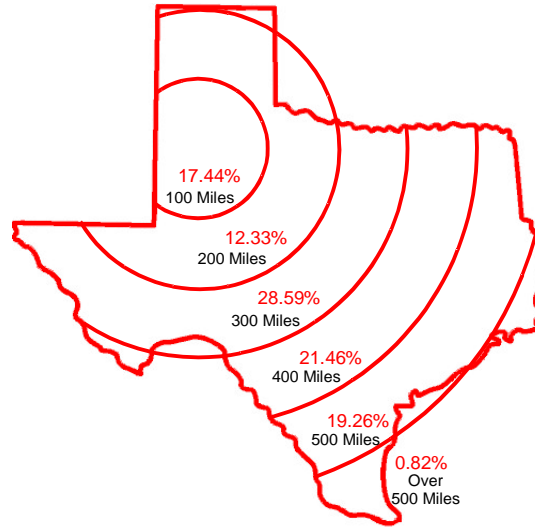
One Year Retention Rate of New Full-Time Freshmen* FY 1998 - 1999 to FY 2002 - 2003

Distribution of New Freshmen from Texas by 100-Mile Increments

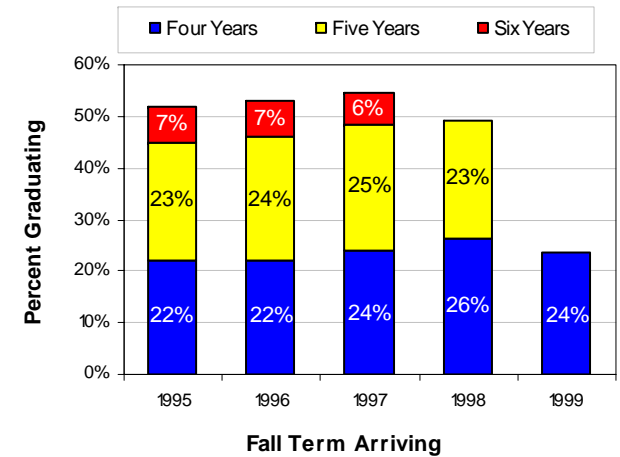

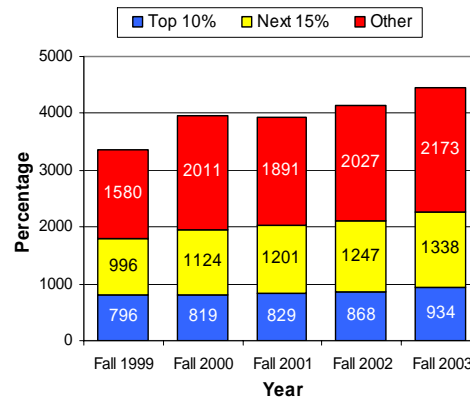
