TEXAS TECH UNIVERSITY HEALTH SCIENCES CENTER – STUDENT FEES Effective Beginning Fall Semester, 2010 Summary of Changes

(A) School of Allied Health Sciences, Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences, School of Nursing, and School of Pharmacy – Non-Resident Students

The tuition rate for non-resident students, including United State Citizens and Foreign students, will increase from \$327 per semester credit hour to \$360 per semester credit hour with no maximum as determined by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

(B) <u>Institutional Tuition</u>

In accordance with Texas Education Code, Section 54.0513, the Office of Student Business Services via the Executive Vice President for Finance and Administration recommends that Institutional Tuition (Designated Tuition) be increased from \$100 per semester credit hour to \$105 per semester credit hour for students enrolled in the School of Allied Health Sciences and the School of Nursing, an increase from \$60 per semester credit hour to \$63 per semester credit hour for students enrolled in the Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences, an increase from \$125 per semester credit hour to \$135 per semester credit hour for students enrolled in the School of Pharmacy, and from \$5,500 annual rate to \$6,000 annual rate for students enrolled in the School of Medicine. The revenue generated from this increase will be used for need-based student financial aid, to recruit and retain qualified faculty and staff, and for general operating expenses.

(C) Clinical Simulation Center Fee

Clinical Simulation is becoming an integral component in health education curricula. A Committee was established to develop a fee structure to provide for the budgetary operations of all Clinical Simulation Centers at the TTUHSC. This committee has recommended that the fee be increased from \$75 to \$125 per clinical course for students enrolled in the School of Nursing; an increase from \$75 to \$500 annual fee for all students enrolled in the Paul L Foster School of Medicine; the establishment of a \$500 annual fee for all students enrolled in the School of Medicine; and the establishment of a fee at a rate of \$75 in the spring semester for 1st year students and \$75 in both the fall and spring semesters for 2nd year students for students enrolled in the School of Pharmacy.

The revenue generated by this fee will be used to cover the costs of supplies, equipment, staff, information technology, maintenance and other operational expenses related to simulation education.

(D) Standardized Patient Fee

The Committee developed to provide a fee structure for clinical simulation centers has recommended the establishment of a Standardized Patient Fee at a rate of \$150 per applicable course for students enrolled in the School of Nursing. This fee is necessary to support the additional costs for training the standardized patients and their hourly wages while performing as a standardized patient. Additionally, the fee assists with the cost related to digital audio-visual recording distribution and archiving of encounters.

(E) Paul L Foster School of Medicine

(1) Computer Usage Fee/Laptop Fee - Paul L Foster School of Medicine

The Paul L Foster School of Medicine recommends the elimination of the \$1,600 Laptop Fee assessed to all 1st year students. In order to continue to purchase and maintain required student laptops, the Paul L Foster School of Medicine recommends the establishment of a \$250 annual Computer Usage Fee to be assessed to all enrolled students. This method of assessment will distribute the cost to the student over four years. The Student Government Association at Paul L Foster School of Medicine supports the recommendation.

(2) Application Fee - Paul L Foster School of Medicine

The Paul L Foster School of Medicine recommends the elimination of the \$50 application fee per applicant. The Paul L Foster School of Medicine is a participant in the Texas Medical and Dental Schools Application Service and utilizes with sufficiency the information provided in the application for the admissions process. The Paul L Foster School of Medicine currently has no need to derive additional information from a secondary application.
