TTUJOS summer camps are designed for students who have completed the 5th, 6th, 7th or 8th grade. Your camper will be taught by TTU's Outdoor School Staff and Natural Resource professionals through engaging hands-on learning and outdoor recreation.

- Learn about water quality and fish that live in the South Llano River
- Identify plants, birds, and native wildlife that share the 411 acre field station
- Watch stars dance in a dark sky and see the Milky Way come to life

- Build self-confidence working with a TEAM on low ropes course challenges

To hold your spot, a \$100 non-refundable registration fee must accompany the form. The remaining balance is due 30 days prior to arrival. You will receive a confirmation letter via email when your registration / permission form and payment has been received.

Refund Policy: Cancellations made 30 days prior to camp arrival will receive a full refund minus the \$100 non-refundable registration fee. Cancellations within 30 days of arrival will forfeit the entire camp fee.

Expectations: The first day of camp, each camper will attend orientation which includes behavior expectations and safety rules. We will emphasize the Student Behavior Guidelines. It is our goal to create an atmosphere where campers feel comfortable, and are excited to get up each day ready to learn new things.

All staff members are trained to handle behavior problems through positive reinforcement, redirection, and if needed, age appropriate consequences.

Rights and Expectations:

We believe all students have the right to a quality outdoor experience. We also believe, as teachers, we are entitled to instruct students without interruptions due to inappropriate student behavior. Please sign below, stating that you and your child have read and understood the following guidelines, consequences and procedures.

Guidelines for Students:

- Will be attentive and participate in all activities to the best of my ability.
- Will respect the rights of others, their property, and TTUJOS property.
- Will not curse, use vulgar language, horseplay, bully, or fight other campers.
- Will not litter, and only put trash in containers provided (inside and out)
- Will be sure to take someone with me wherever I go, unless told otherwise by staff.
- Will only use activity areas during allotted times, supervised by TTUJOS staff.
- Can use mobile phones only at designated times approved by TTUJOS staff.
- Tunderstands that non-compliance of guidelines could mean automatic dismissal.

Consequences and Procedures:

- Students will receive a verbal warning.
- If misbehavior continues, parents/guardians will be notified, and student will lose their right to participate in activities and possibly be sent home.

Texas Tech University Outdoor School Junction, TX Summer Camp Information Sheet



The Texas Tech University Outdoor School is devoted to creating innovative educational programs. We provide a setting where children become engaged in the natural world and discover the joy of learning. We immerse learners in authentic, hands-on activities that stimulate imagination, develop a curiosity about life, and create an environment where we share discoveries.

The Outdoor School is staffed by certified teachers and staff who work to monitor and care for your child for the duration of their stay.

Why should your child go to The TTUJOS Summer Camp?

- The TTUJOS Summer Camp will provide your child with meaningful science learning alongside engaging recreational activities.
- The TTUJOS Summer Camp has designed environmental programs that meet state educational standards, incorporate outdoor recreational activities, and develop the leaders of tomorrow through teamwork and a community service project.

Students will attend TTUJOS Summer Camp for either 3 or 5 days. During this stay, they will become Scientists, Astronomers, Ecologists, Ornithologists, Aquatic Biologists, and Nature Explorers. Students will collect and record data using the scientific method throughout their stay.

Will my child receive excellent care?

- Yes, facilities are kept very clean and dorms are climate controlled for comfort.
- Yes, meals are nutritious and served by certified food handlers in the university cafeteria.
- Yes, instructors will ensure that campers get their rest, and any special health concerns such as allergies, diet, medication, or sleepwalking will be properly cared for. Personal matters are kept confidential.

Clothes and Equipment

PLEASE LABEL all equipment and clothing with your child's name. Students will be outdoors, so be prepared for **any type** of weather. Clothing for The TTUJOS Summer Camp should be rugged and informal.

Bedding – pack bedding in a plastic bag so that it stays clean and dry.

- Pillow with pillowcase
- Sleeping bag or sheet and blanket

Clothing and Personal Items

- Enough clothing for the scheduled days, plus one extra outfit
- T Long pants: jeans or other rugged pants.
- Shorts: use of shorts will be limited by activity
- Sweatshirt, windbreaker, or jacket
- Extra socks in a zippered bag for the river
- Closed-toe, durable shoes (No flip-flops, crocs, or sandals, please)
- Sleepwear (shorts are acceptable as sleepwear)
- **T** Extra shoes that can be used in the river (No flip-flops, crocs, or sandals)

Shower Needs

- Toiletry items: deodorant, soap, toothpaste, toothbrush, comb/brush, etc.
- Washcloth and towel
- Optional: shower shoes or *flip-flops* may only be worn for showering

Other Needs

- Rain gear or poncho just in case
- Insect repellent
- Sunscreen and lip balm
- Disposable camera, labeled with student name
- Hat/Visor and sunglasses
- Plastic bag for dirty/wet clothes
- Optional items
 - o Flashlight
 - Letter writing materials (stamp, envelope, paper)

Please do NOT bring:

- Curling Irons, Flat irons, or hair dryers (we will provide hair dryers if needed)

Parent Information Letter Research Study

Dear Parent/Guardian,

In order to determine effectiveness of the Outdoor School program, and in particular, the TTUJOS Summer Camp, we are conducting a research study. The study involves students taking a pre-survey at the start of the camp and a post- survey at the end of camp. These surveys will not include student names and are voluntary. If you and your student agree, by signing consent forms, they will be given the surveys. If not, they will participate in alternate activities when the surveys are given.

The pre-survey was designed to show student's awareness and knowledge of certain environmental education issues and concepts before participating in any camp activity or lesson. The post-survey was designed to show student growth in their awareness and knowledge of certain environmental education issues and concepts. The surveys also include a section on demographic data in order to determine if there are any significant differences based on race, gender, grade level, and family activities.

Your help in the research study will provide Texas Tech University Outdoor School and the Llano River Field Station with data that shows program effectiveness as well as areas for improvement.

Parent Consent Form

Thank you for your interest in allowing your child to participate in our research. This form describes the project and what kind of questions we will be asking. Please read over it carefully and let us know if you have any questions.

What is the purpose of this research?

We are interested in learning how much your child knows about the natural environment at the beginning of their camp adventure. We are also interested in how your child's knowledge of the natural environment changes after attending their Summer Camp Adventure.

What will be asked?

Your child will be given two surveys, one at the start and one at the end of their Summer Camp Adventure, asking a variety of questions concerning what they know about the natural environment.

Are there any risks to participating?

We do not expect your child to encounter any risks other than those experienced in everyday life.

Will my child's privacy be protected?

Yes! Your child's privacy is important to us. Surveys will not include your child's name or any other personal information that would allow someone to identify them. Data about your child's ethnicity, race, recently completed grade in school, and age will be collected and used in our group data. This will allow us to determine if trends in the data exist, allowing us to improve the effectiveness or future camps. In any report that we publish, we will not report individual responses, only overall responses for the group.

Is this research voluntary?

Yes, your child's participation in the pre/post-survey is completely voluntary. Whether your child participates in the survey or not will not effect their stay or relationship with Texas Tech University or the Outdoor School.

Will my child or I receive any compensation for participating?

No. There is no compensation for participating in the survey.
